

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board Of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 27, 1952 at 2:00.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on September 3, 1952 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Grumman Aircraft Engineering Corporation requesting permission to construct culverts across Swan Pond Road in the Town of Riverhead. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved, that permission be granted to the Grumman Aircraft Engineering Corporation to lay certain culverts under Swan Pond Road in the hamlet of Calverton, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, as more fully described on a map covering above mentioned area, subject to the following conditions:

1. Road to be kept open for vehicular traffic.
2. Road after work is done to be repaired and placed in as good condition as when entered upon.
3. To proceed as expeditiously as possible for the widening and proper surfacing of this highway.

The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved, that a Riverhead Town Clinic be held for all Town Officers for the purpose of discussing the problems of the Town and that all necessary expenses be paid. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

A communication was read from Karen Hess, Secretary of the Suffolk County American Labor Party requesting permission to operate, in the Town of Riverhead, a public address system mounted on a car during the period from October 3, 1952 to October 11th, to encourage registration, and thenceforth until November 4th, excepting Sundays. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion and vote it was the consensus of opinion of the Board that the request of the Suffolk County American Labor Party be granted, provided that there will be no complaints and upon arrival in the Town, they are to contact Police Headquarters in order that they may know the time the loud speaker is here.

A communication was read from William Skarka tendering his resignation as School Traffic Policeman, effective September 16, 1952. The communication was ordered placed on file

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On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the resignation of William Skarka as School Traffic Patrolman, effective September 16, 1952 be and the same is hereby accepted. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that Paul G. White be and he hereby is appointed School Traffic Patrolman for the Roanoke Avenue School to serve at the pleasure of the Board under the supervision of the Chief of Police, salary fixed at the rate of \$1.35 per hour. The vote, Justices Warner, Yousik and Gatz Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Dr. Peter B. Zuhoski tendering his resignation as a member of the Town of Riverhead Planning Board. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the resignation of Dr. Peter B. Zuhoski as a member of the Town of Riverhead Planning Board be accepted with regret. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

A legal Notice was read from the Department of Health, Water Pollution Control Board giving notice that a public hearing will be held in the Supreme Court Room, Suffolk County Court House, Riverhead, New York on September 25, 1952, to consider proposals for the official classification of and assignment of standards of quality and purity to all surface waters contained within the Peconic River-Flanders Bay Drainage Basin, within Suffolk County, New York. The notice was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Harry G. Penny, Secretary to the Riverhead Fire Department submitting the Fire Department Budget for 1953. The communication and budget was ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's report for the month of August, 1952 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by 21 employees of the Riverhead Town Highway Department requesting an increase in wages was submitted to the Board and ~~and referred to~~ referred to the Highway Committee.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved, that June Stakey of Aquebogue, New York be appointed a Senior Clerk for the Town of Riverhead subject to the rules and regulations of the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission, effective September 23, 1952, salary fixed at the rate of \$3600.00 per annum, payable semi-monthly. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik and Gatz Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that Justice Charles W. Gatz be authorized to investigate the further possibility of acquiring Beach property for a Town Beach. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

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The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date the total of which were as follows: General Town Fund-\$2,288.96, Highway Machinery Fund-\$239.88.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, October 1, 1953 at 2:00 P.M.
