

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on August 18, 1964 at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on August 4, 1964 be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Absent, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mrs. Richard White representing the Aquebogue Civic Association appeared before the Board and inquired as to the progress being made relative to the dredging of Reeves, Terry and Sawmill Creeks at Aquebogue.

Supervisor Vojvoda replied to Mrs. White stating that he has received several communications relative to the matter, one being from the Department of Public Works stating that the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service has requested this matter be held in abeyance until September 15, 1964 pending further inspection in the area.

Supervisor Vojvoda further stated that he has submitted copies of the Aquebogue Civic Association's letter to all departments concerned and asked the Association to pursue this matter by writing directly to the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and further informed Mrs. White that he had requested the Health Department to contact the Fish and Wildlife Service stressing the importance of an early inspection.

Mrs. White exhibited a sample of water taken from the waters of Meetinghouse Creek area and informed the Board that the duck growers are continuing to dump duck wastes and that the Creek has rows of slime floating atop and that the condition of the waters have worsened. Mrs. White inquired if the Town Board would adopt an ordinance to resolve the matter.

Supervisor Vojvoda replied to Mrs. White stating that this would necessitate the hiring of special attorneys to look into the matter of adopting an ordinance that would not conflict with County or State laws and further stated that the matter will be referred to the Town Attorney to confer with the County Attorney as to whether an ordinance or a local law could be adopted.

Mr. Joseph Danielowich, Deephole Road, Calverton, N. Y., appeared before the Board relative to tenants of the Migrant Camp located across from his residence and reiterated complaints submitted at the July 7, 1964 meeting of the Town Board.

Mr. Danielowich stated that conditions have reached the point where he and his family are being forced to find a haven away from the area of the Camp during weekends.

Mr. Danielowich further stated that the Police Department has been unable to curb the tenants from trespassing on private properties and asked the Town Board what disciplinary measures could be invoked to check the trespassers.

After discussion the Board decided that the Crew Leader of the Migrant Camp be called to meet with the Supervisor and the Chief of Police to resolve the problem as presented by Mr. Danielowich.

Police Chief Grodski addressed the Board stating that the FBI is conducting a one day Conference scheduled at Bear Mountain State Park on August 26, 1964 and requested that he and three officers be authorized to attend and be permitted the use of a police car for transportation.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That Police Chief Grodski and three members of the Police Department be and they are authorized to attend a one day FBI Conference at Bear Mountain State Park, N. Y., on August 26, 1964, to be transported by a local police unit and that all necessary related expenses be paid.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Police Chief Grodski addressed the Board and asked its consideration to imposing a Parking Restriction on Osborne Avenue between Lincoln and Pulaski Streets on the East side to allow a better and safer flow of traffic.

The Board referred the suggestion to the Police Committee and the Town Attorney for consideration at the time of drawing up the Traffic Ordinance.

Police Chief Grodski submitted the following report on the status of the jail cells:
All cement work being completed.
Cells are being painted.
Electricity and heating installations completed.

Supervisor Vojvoda informed Police Chief Grodski that arrangements have been made to grade and oil the new parking field facilities.

Town Attorney Scheinberg informed the Board that the existing Junk Yard Ordinance requires that letters be mailed to adjacent owners to the property of a proposed Junk Yard and those persons have a given time of not less than ten days from receiving notice to show cause why such a license shall not be issued.

Mr. Norman Golub appeared before the Board relative to his request for a Junk Yard License for a proposed Used-Auto Business on property located on Raynor Avenue, Riverhead, N. Y., formerly occupied by Philbrick Starch Factory.

Mr. Golub informed the Board that he would road-bed the ground with oil to prevent any waste seepage into the ground and would provide and install dry wells to rid water from the land.

Mr. Golub further outlined to the Board that all batteries containing acids and rust waters would be stored in the building, that there will be no burning only in torch work in separating bodies of autos and that he is mainly interested in salvage, that only 10 or 15 cars would be stored on the grounds at any time and any surplus number would be removed.

Mr. Golub assured the Board that it is his intention to conduct the business in a clean and orderly fashion.

Mr. John Schmedja addressed the Board stating that he is the owner of property on Raynor Avenue which is zoned residential and that he favors the property formerly occupied by Philbrick Starch as a factory site but is opposed to it becoming a Junk Yard for the reasons that the movement of traffic on Raynor Avenue would be hindered, that a great deal of burning would take place if this proposed business was established as it was his understanding that the steel industry would not accept dismantled bodies of cars unless they were burned.

John P. Riesdorff, Water Plant Superintendent addressed the Board and stated that he is opposed to the establishment of the proposed Junk Yard on Raynor Avenue for the reason that it would involve much expenditures of money to correct the condition of the waters brought about by rust and iron waste seepage regardless of Mr. Golub's well meaning intentions to install dry wells and oiling of top surface.

Police Chief Groski addressed the Board stating that normally a Junk Yard presents many problems and requires much supervision by the Police Department and expressed opinion that the existing Junk Yard Ordinance needs revising.

Mr. John Mezeinka owner of property on Raynor Avenue spoke in opposition to the establishment of a Junk Yard on Raynor Avenue.

Supervisor Vojvoda advised Mr. Golub that the Board would table the decision on his application for a Junk Yard License pending conference with the Suffolk County Health Department to look into the possibility of no water contamination and also pending the revision of the Junk Yard Ordinance and that Mr. Golub will be advised when a decision is reached.

A communication was submitted to the Board from Mrs. Edward C. Parker, under date of August 5, 1964, making inquiry as to the relative position of a road portion situated in the area of Fourth Street, West of Main Street, connecting with Center Street in South Jamesport.

The communication was ordered placed on file.

Town Attorney Shepard Scheinberg informed the Board that he has made an investigation as to whether that portion of Fourth Street that lies west of Main Street and connects with Center Street in South Jamesport is a private or public highway and said investigation disclosed that it is a private road.

A communication was submitted to the Board from the Wading River Civic Ass'n under date of August 12, 1964 relative to pending petition making request to the Town Board to take immediate steps to rezone all Residence and Farm Zone properties in the Wading River School District and asking the Board to act favorably on the petition or to initiate the Comprehensive Planning Program by applying its zoning requirements to the Wading River area.

The communication was ordered placed on file and the Town Clerk was requested to supply copies of said communication to the Town Board members.

The Highway Committee reported that the approval of applications for curbs and gutters of Mr. Hugh Wilson, 60 Further Lane, Riverhead, N. Y., Mr. Joseph C. Shaffery, Daley Drive, Riverhead, N. Y., and Mr. William Humphrey, 59 Further Lane, Riverhead, N. Y., is being held in abeyance pending correction of drainage problems in the area by the Highway Department.

The matter of adopting Excavation Ordinance No. 31 was discussed by the Board and it was decided that a special meeting be held with the Board members and sand-pit operators to finalize the drafting of said ordinance.

The matter of the Town Hall Rental Option with Roanoke Lodge No. 462 was referred to the Town Attorney.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and is hereby directed to publish in the August 20, 1964, issue of the News Review a Notice of Public Hearing for the purpose of hearing all persons who wish to speak on proposed Local Law Intro. No. 1A providing for public notices relating to adoption of local laws, and on proposed Local Law Intro. 2A relating to the term of office of Superintendent of Highways, Town Clerk and Receiver of Taxes.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga informed the Board that arrangements have been finalized for the Dedication of Elmer Stotzky Memorial Park for August 20, 1964 at 8:00 P. M., that ample publicity has been given inviting the public to attend and that the Riverhead Lion's Club has donated the Plaque. Justice Zaloga requested that all Town Officials be in attendance at an early time so that the ceremonies may begin as scheduled.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills submitted on Warrants dated August 18, 1964 as follows: General Town - \$18,029.50, General Repairs Highway Item No. 1 - \$2,858.31, Machinery Highway Item No. 3-\$1,350.59, and Miscellaneous Highway Item No. 4- \$890.90.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That General Repairs Highway Item No. 1 Bills in the amount of \$2,858.31, Machinery Highway Item No. 3 Bills in the amount of \$1,350.59, and Miscellaneous Highway Item No. 4 Bills in the amount of \$890.90 be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.
