COMMUNICATIONS

Long Island Lighting Company, dated 10/12/71, submitting survey and annual increase of \$31.20 for installation of a light fixture on Pole #17, Harrison Avenue, within the Riverhead Lighting District. Filed.

Raynor Avenue Taxpayers, dated 10/14/71, requesting improved street lighting for entire length of Raynor Avenue. Filed.

Suffolk County Dept. of Health, dated 10/12/71, advising that the Suffolk County Legislature working in conjunction with the Department of Traffic Safety and Dept. of Health has accepted matching fund Federal Grant through the Emergency Medical Services Committee to provide a county-wide emergency medical services communication system. This grant will provide mobile 2-way radio receivers to be placed in ambulances providing emergency transportation services in Suffolk County. Each of the hospitals in the County will either be provided with such a radio or will be connected to the system. Asking form be filled out if interested. Filed.

Raymond, Edward and Frank McKay, dated October 7th, 1971, re:claim that property they sold to Northville Corporation was rezoned for their accommodation - stating that a six man board composed of leading citizens reviewed the zoning ordinance of the Town and presented their findings and recommendations to the Town Board and after a public hearing where there were no objections, the recommendations were adopted on June 8th, 1969. That their farm was one of the parcels which was rezoned to heavy industry - this farm was listed for sale on May 5, 1969 - and a sale was consummated to the Northville Dock Corporation on the date of Feb. 6, 1970. That this information should refute any claim that the property was rezoned for the Northville Dock Corporation. Filed.

COMMUNICATIONS continued:

Anthony J. Braun, Secy, Peconic Bay Powers Squadron, Inc., dated 10/18/71- stating the Squadron is an organization of boating people whose only interest is in boating safety through education. That many of its members have reported observing many near accidents near the entrance of and in East Creek, Flanders Bay and Peconic River by small speed boat operators who do not obey the rules and regulation and this places in jeopardy the property and lives of all persons using the recreational waterways. Further stating that near by townships control these hazards by police sea patrol and further stating that the 4th of July was particularly bad at South Jamesport after dark, with outboards going at high speed and many without running lights. Requesting the Board to take action to increase safe boating in the area by having a police boat patrol on busy summer weekends. Filed.

Copies to Police Chief and Town Board.

Supervisor Zaloga stated: "The Board has taken the position to provide a boat beginning with the next boating season and it will be operated by an officer."

Georgette Case, dated 10/14/71, requesting information on the Swedenborg Cemetery on Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, N. Y., as to who is in charge of keeping it clean, etc. Filed.

Referred to Town Clerk for reply.

Supervisor Zaloga asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Dr. Caryl Granttham, representing the Riverhead First Committee, read the following statement addressed to the Members of the Riverhead Town Board:

"The Riverhead First Committee wants to take this opportunity to commend you, the members of the Riverhead Town Board, for approval of the resolution to update the Riverhead Master Plan.

This step initiates a most urgent project for this Town - the revising and revitalizing of what should become the realistic guide to the orderly growth and development of Riverhead. But this is only a first step. If the Plan is to accomplish its goals it must receive the firm commitment of all segments of the community from the Town Fathers on down. You must encourage a continuing dialogue, a meaningful process of exchange, through meetings, press coverage, every means at your command to keep the public informed and at the same time receive from the public its best judgment as to what kind of Town it wants. Nothing must be permitted this time to impede or impair the vital operation of good planning for this Town. It will be money well spent if the results of this effort can receive formal legislative approval and continuing implementation and budgetary support.

We stand ready, as we are sure all citizens of Riverhead do, to support and assist you in every way. We are confident the Town can grow and develop and also protect its basic good qualities of living. Only through good planning and zoning can we provide the sense of security, fairness and protection for those of us who already live and work here but for those who may want to come, build homes and develop new business and industry.

Again, we compliment you on your forward-looking action." (End)

At the conclusion of Dr. Granttham's statement, Town Justice Costello said: "Thank you very much for your very kind letter Dr. Granttham, but I would like to know who "we" are - remember about six weeks ago I asked and was told I'd have the information".

Dr. Granttham: I appreciate your interest Judge Costello. I have heard this Board say many times-you want citizens' support and interest - you have it - I think that's as far as I can go.

Judge Costello: In other words what you are saying is "we" - you have no officers -.

Dr. Granttham: Yes, and I don't think it's germane particularly to our support to you that this be disclosed.

Judge Costello: Well, is it a hidden organization? I would like to know the officers if it's a point of public information.

Dr. Granttham: At the proper time you shall know this.

Supervisor Zaloga: Dr. Granttham-just to make a remark-we do want to create all the public interest that we can and very soon, perhaps this week - a brochure type folder will go out to every resident of the Town of Riverhead and a questionnaire answer type thing that will come back to us - and when everything is compiled from it we will begin the study with everyone involved - every organization- I don't believe in overloading any committees and this is why they have not been done.

Dr. Granttham: I have been in touch with Mr. Rueter and we feel very deeply that this is money that needs to be spent - and we also feel every organization in Town must be informed.

Supervisor Zaloga: We feel that way too.

Mrs. Claire Kratt: At the September 9th Town Board Meeting we understood that a feasibility study of the Reeve's Park Improvement District would be done and the cost of this study would be borne by the Town - we have heard nothing since.

Supervisor Zaloga: The study has begun - we have a resolution this morning hiring Alden Young at no feasibility cost to the Town of Riverhead - if the project should succeed it will be charged to the project.

Mrs. Mildred Dorman: Did you say at no cost to the Town - will Mr. Young do this?

Supervisor Zaloga read the resolution "hiring Alden W. Young, P. E.", for the road project and stated it will be offered this morning.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Police Chief Stephen J. Grodski reported as follows:

One Police Patrolman recently hired has declined the appointment and there will be no Civil Service lists available until January, 1972.

Bad accident involving nine youths occurring at Sound Avenue, west of Northville Turnpike, due to area needing immediate re-surfacing.

Discussion disclosed that the area had been resurfaced by the Highway Department.

Mr. Carl Stagg asked if the Town Board has the authority to establish weight limits for town roads.

Supervisor Zaloga stated that the State has such laws on its roads and the Town can do so on town highways.

Mr. Stagg asked the Town Board to consider this.

Supervisor Zaloga stated that if the Town put these limits on town roads, the farmers can't cart their potatoes to the various stations.

Supervisor Zaloga recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of posting and publishing Notice of Public Hearing on proposed amendment to Town Ordinance No. 18, Regulating the Use of Recreation Centers and Public Beaches, - relating to parking permits.

The affidavits were ordered filed.

Supervisor Zaloga thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Carl Stagg, 609 Northville Turnpike, Riverhead, stated he is opposed to residents of the Town having to pay a \$2.00 fee for beach parking for they pay enough taxes and shouldn't have to pay this fee - that he doesn't believe it should be regarded as a revenue as not enough people buy this beach parking permit to make it worthwhile.

Mr. Stagg further stated that any resident of the Town should be given a parking permit upon presenting credentials that he is a resident - that only visitors should be compelled to pay for parking privileges and sliding scale fees be applied to them.

Mrs. Mildred Dorman, President of Sr. Citizens, stated this amendment is being presented at the request of the people over 60 and the disabled and made inquiry on the number of parking permits sold by the Town.

Supervisor Zaloga: We realize about \$6000 on the sale of these permits.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A. M. continued:

Mrs. Dorman: The people over 60 years of age are in the minority so much that it won't affect your budget at all.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Zaloga declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the Meeting.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and is hereby authorized to advertise in the NEWS-REVIEW, the official town newspaper, for sealed bids for four (4) New 1972 Police Vehicles for use of the Riverhead Town Police Department, and be it

RESOLVED, that specifications be prepared by the Police Chief and bids to be returnable up to 11:00 A. M., on November 1st, 1971, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and hereby is designated to open publicly and read aloud on November 1st, 1971, at 11:00 A. M., at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, all sealed bids bearing the designation, "BID ON 4 POLICE CARS".

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Island Lighting Company be and is hereby authorized to replace one 1000 Lumen Street Light Fixture on Pole #17, Harrison Avenue with a 7600 Lumen Mercury Vapor Street Fixture, at an increased cost of \$31.20 per annum, as per survey outlined under date of October 12, 1971.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, that due to the fact that Election Day falls on the same day as the regularly scheduled Town Board Meeting, that the first November meeting of the Riverhead Town Board be held on Wednesday, November 3rd, 1971 at 10:30 A. M., and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is hereby authorized to publish Notice of the aforesaid meeting in the News-Review, and to post a copy of the same on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Zaloga recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:15 A. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting Public Notice Calling Public Hearing on proposed amendment to Ordinance No. 3, Traffic Control and Parking.

The affidavits were ordered filed.

Supervisor Zaloga thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Mr. Harold Mezick appeared before the Board and stated that some good has come out of the meetings held on this matter - Hoccabuck Park has become civic conscious - they now have a civic association - actually for 27 years no one objected to the use of this area and the people never exercised their deed rights.

Mr. Mezick further stated that it will be in the interest of the Town of Riverhead and the Police Department to restrict the area and anyone wishing to fish in the area will have to get permission from one of the "deeded rights" residents.

Mr. Kenneth Ross stated this is the first time he has heard there is a civic association - he has never received word or notice nor was he invited.

Mr. Ross asked if this amendment means that as a resident of Hoccabuck Park he will be prohibited in parking his car at the end of Meeting House Creek Road.

Supervisor Zaloga: Yes, it does.

Mr. Ross: My deed strictly says I have certain rights and my rights will be violated if this amendment is passed.

Town Attorney John J. Munzel: Your deed rights do not allow you to park on a public road - any more than my deed would allow me to park on Riverside Drive - it's a public highway open to the public thorough-fare and subject to the regulations of the Town as a public road.

Mr. Ross: I would question how this ordinance will be upheld - will it be like the dog ordinance that we passed and is not enforced.

Mr. Munzel: The dog ordinance is enforced - we do have a dog warden who picks up dogs - the Police Department enforces the parking ordinance.

Supervisor Zaloga: We thought this would be the approach, perhaps it is and perhaps it isn't - we may have to go further.

Mr. Ross: I don't want the members of the Civic Association to misinterpret my remarks - I am not opposing the ordinance - I am wondering if my deed rights will be violated and whether it will be an enforced ordinance.

Supervisor Zaloga: We hope so.

PUBLIC HEARING 11:15 A. M. continued:

Judge Costello: Mr. Ross, I think your deeded rights give you access to the beach - you can go to the beach - perhaps not in a vehicle - you can go and enjoy the facilities, but you can't park a vehicle there - you can drive there and come back.

Mr. Ross: My deed also says "use of all existing roads" and I assume your definition of use means in "movement" and not "stationary".

Judge Costello: That's correct.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Zaloga declared the hearing closed and reopened the Meeting.

RESOLUTIONS

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, that Alden W. Young, Professional Engineer, is hereby directed to prepare all necessary plans, petitions, reports and specifications for the improvement of roads in the area encompassed by realty subdivision as shown on maps of "Reeves Park Beach Company" filed in the Office of the Clerk of the County of Suffolk, and all fees shall be charged to the road improvement area when same is created or approved.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, application has been made for a building permit to install a compacter behind Hills Supermarket, Inc., and

WHEREAS, said application requires a Special Permit of the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 26 and Ordinance No. 35, and the laws of the State of New York require that the application be made by the owner or his authorized representative, and

WHEREAS, we have received notice from the owner of the property and from his attorney, Costa L. Papson, Esq., that the applicant, Hills Supermarket, Inc., is neither the owner nor an authorized representative of the owner,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the application for the construction for the compacter behind Hills Supermarket, Inc., at the Riverhead Shopping Plaza is denied for the sole reason that the applicant is not the owner or the authorized representative of the owner. The Town Board makes no determination of the application on its merits due to the procedural deficiency.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the acceptance of said bid is subject to the approval of the Suffolk County Superintendent of Highways/Suffolk County Commissioner of Public Works.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That four members of the Riverhead Town Police Department be and are authorized to attend an FBI Law Enforcement Conference on a topic "Organized Crime Controls" to be held at Bethpage State Park Clubhouse, Bethpage, N. Y. , on Wednesday, October 20, 1971, and that all related expenses be paid by the Town of Riverhead.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Long Island Lighting Company be and is hereby authorized to make a survey for the installation of improved street lighting on Raynor Avenue (to include entire length), said area located within the Riverhead Lighting District.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLUTION

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, New York, held at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on the 19th day of October, 1971, the following resolution was duly adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, State of New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided for in order that an amendment to Town Ordinance No. 18, Regulating the Use of Recreation Centers and Public Beaches, Section 2, as amended, may be adopted by the Town,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby ordains and enacts the following amendment to Ordinance No. 18, Section 2:

- a. Vehicles entering any public bathing beach or recreation center shall enter only at designated entrances and leave only through designated exits. Parking of all vehicles is permitted only in spaces indicated therefor. Only vehicles displaying a parking permit obtained as hereinafter provided, shall be permitted to park in the spaces provided at any public bathing beach or recreation center.
- b. The Town Clerk, or other persons authorized by him, is hereby authorized to issue a parking permit for use at any public bathing beach or recreation center; to any of the following persons; residents, inhabitants, tenants or taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead upon application of such person and upon payment of an annual fee of \$2.00. Excepted from payment of said annual fee shall be all residents, inhabitants, tenants or taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead who can furnish proof of being over 60 years of age or proof of receiving a disability allowance from the Social Security Administration.
- c. Such permits shall be evidence by a printed sticker which shall be prominently displayed on the vehicle for which it was issued. Lost or defaced stickers may be re-issued. All parking permits shall expire on the last day of December of each year and may be renewed on or after the first day of January.

AND THE TOWN CLERK is hereby authorized and directed to enter said amendments to Ordinance No. 18, Regulating the Use of Recreation Centers and Public Beaches, Section 2 as amended, in the Minutes of the Town Board, and to publish a copy once in the News-Review, the official newspaper of the Town, and to post a copy of same on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk, pursuant to Subdiv. 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, and file in her office affidavits of said publication and posting.

The adoption of the aforesaid amendment to Ordinance No. 18, Section 2, as amended, shall take effect 10 days after such publication and posting.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, State of New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided for in order that an amendment to Town Ordinance No. 3, "Traffic Control and Parking", Section 4, Subdivision A, as amended, may be adopted by the Town,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, hereby ordains and enacts the following amendment to Ordinance No. 3, Section 4, Subdivision A:

Section 4: Parking, Standing and Stopping,

Subdiv. A: Prohibition of Parking:

#30 Along the curbs located south of Harbor Road and Meetinghouse Creek Road on the east and west sides and the southerly terminus of Meetinghouse Creek Road.

AND the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to enter said amendment to Ordinance No. 3, Section 4, Subdiv. A as amended in the Minutes of the Town Board, and to publish a copy once in the News-Review, the official newspaper of the Town, and to post on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk a copy of same, pursuant to Subdiv. 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, and file in her office affidavits of said publication and posting.

The adoption of the aforesaid amendment to Ordinance No. 3, Section 4, Subdiv. A, as amended, shall take effect 10 days after such publication and posting.

RESOLVED after a disciplinary hearing before Independent Hearing Officer, John Hurley, Esq., pursuant to the Civil Service Law Section 75 was reported to this Board that Edmund Buziak should be dismissed on the grounds of Misconduct, and

RESOLUTION continued:

WHEREAS, said Edmund Buziak has requested that due to a serious illness he be permitted to resign his position as Construction Equipment Operator effective as of the date of his suspension from the Town Highway Department on the 7th day of August, 1968, and

WHEREAS, after conference with counsel for Edmund Buziak, the Town Board feels that in view of the serious illness of said Edmund Buziak and in the light of long years of service with the Town of Riverhead, that it should be in the best interest as means were afforded to Edmund Buziak.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the resignation of Edmund Buziak, Construction Equipment Operator, is hereby accepted effective the 7th day of August, 1968, with the specific understanding that the said Edmund Buziak has made no claims for any back pay, and


IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that Town Supervisor Bruno Zaloga and Highway Superintendent Alex E. Horton are hereby authorized to execute a release on the Town of Riverhead and the said Edmund Buziak.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that in view of the above, that the Town Supervisor and the said Alex E. Horton are hereby authorized to withdraw pending criminal charges before Town Justice E. Berkery, lodged against said Edmund Buziak.
