COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, MAY 17, 1960 BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

REPORT OF KENNETH D. ROWLAND, DIRECTOR OF RECREATION, FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 1960, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

POLICE REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 1960 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 1960 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

A COMMUNICATION FROM F.C. FURMAN, WADING RIVER, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"I WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A RECOMMENDATION TO THE TOWN BOARD, THAT THEY SHOULD GET A HIGHWAY MAP MADE AND PRESENT IT TO THE TOWN SUPERINTENDENT OF RIVERHEAD, SO HE WILL KNOW WHERE THE HIGHWAYS START AND FINISH, SO HE WILL NOT OIL AND SAND PRIVATE PARKING LOTS AND FENCED OFF PRIVATE DRIVEWAYS, AS WAS DONE AT GREENBRIER INN. I BELIEVE WHEN A HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT USES TOWN EQUIPMENT AND TOWN ROAD OIL ON PRIVATE PROPERTY, SOMETHING SHOULD BE DONE." END.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

WHEREAS, THE FLAGS OF THIS NATION HAVE ALWAYS BEEN EMBLEMATIC OF THE DEMOCRATIC PRINCIPALS UNDERLYING OUR SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT, AND

WHEREAS, THE 14TH DAY OF JUNE HAS BEEN SET ASIDE, THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES, FOR THE CELEBRATION OF FLAG DAY, AND

WHEREAS, THE 12TH DAY OF JUNE HAS BEEN CHOSEN BY THE RIVERHEAD ELKS LODGE #2044 AS THE DAY FOR CONDUCTING CEREMONIES, OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, FOR HONORING ALL THE FLAGS WHICH HAVE SYMBOLIZED THE SPIRIT OF OUR NATION, AND

WHEREAS, IT IS THE SENSE OF THE RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD TO SET A PRECEDENT WORTHY OF EMULATION BY THE OTHER TOWN AND VILLAGES THROUGHOUT SUFFOLK COUNTY AND ACROSS THE UNITED STATES, IN HONORING OUR FLAG AS THE SYMBOL OF FREEDOM, NOW, BE IT

RESOLVED, THAT THE SEVEN DAYS FROM JUNE 8TH TO JUNE 14TH, BOTH DATES INCLUSIVE, BE KNOWN AS FLAG WEEK IN THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERHEAD.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM J. LEONARD, SUPERVISOR OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM JUNE 8TH TO JUNE 14TH, AS FLAG WEEK IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND CALL UPON ALL CITIZENS, ORGANIZATIONS AND SCHOOLS TO JOIN IN THIS OBSERVANCE IN REDEDICATING TO THE SPIRIT OF INDEPENDENCE AND DEMOCRATIC PRINCIPLES FOR WHICH THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES IS SYMBOLIC THROUGHOUT THE FREE WORLD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COMMUNICATIONS DATED MAY 12, 1960 AND MAY 31, 1960 FROM MR. WILLIAM N. LEONARD, PLANNING CONSULTANT, SUFFOLK COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION, WERE SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT THE TOWN PURCHASE A FULL PAGE AD IN "INDUSTRIAL WORLD" AT A COST OF \$170.00.

COMMUNICATIONS ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 6, 1960 FROM MR. MALCOLM STEWART, PRESIDENT, RIVERHEAD AUXILIARY POLICE ASSOCIATION, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT THE BOARD PASS A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING QUALIFIED MEMBERS OF THE AUXILIARY POLICE TO CARRY SIDEARMS WHILE ON DUTY.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A PETITION SIGNED BY NUMEROUS RIVERHEAD MERCHANTS WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT THE TOWN PURCHASE THE SUFFOLK COUNTY NATIONAL BANK BUILDING ON MAIN STREET FOR USE AS A TOWN HALL.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 20, 1960 FROM MR. ROBERT NOSTRAND, ARCHITECT FOR THE NEW FRANKLIN NATIONAL BANK BUILDING ON WEST MAIN STREET, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT PARKING METER #W53 BE PERMANENTLY REMOVED FROM THE SOUTH SIDE OF WEST MAIN STREET TO PERMIT CONSTRUCTION OF A DRIVEWAY FOR THE BANK.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 26, 1960 FROM MR. JOSEPH A. KELLER, RIVERHEAD, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"DURING THE WEEK OF AUGUST 14TH 1960 THE FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK WILL HOLD IT'S 88TH ANNUAL CONVENTION HERE IN RIVERHEAD. WE RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THAT THIS WEEK BE DECLARED "FIREMEN'S WEEK IN RIVERHEAD" IN HONOR OF THIS GREAT ORGANIZATION AND THE THOUSAND OF VOLUNTEER FIREMEN THROUGH-OUT THE STATE. WE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO REQUEST THAT DURING THIS WEEK NO PERMITS FOR BAZAARS, CARNIVALS, SOLICITORS OR PEDDLERS OF FIREMENS SOUVENIRS BE GIVEN EXCEPT TO THE RIVERHEAD FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION. HOPING YOU WILL FAVOR US WITH YOUR SUPPORT IN THIS, I REMAIN,..."

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO REPLY THAT THE WEEK OF AUGUST 14TH WILL BE DECLARED "FIREMAN'S WEEK IN RIVERHEAD". FURTHER, IN REGARD TO PERMITS FOR CARNIVALS AND BAZAARS, THE TOWN BOARD DOES NOT HAVE CONTROL OF AFFAIRS IF HELD ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 23, 1960 FROM VAN DYCK & YOUSIK, INC., WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT TIRE PRICES UNDER THE NEW YORK STATE CONTRACT HAVE BEEN INCREASED EFFECTIVE APRIL 11, 1960. IN THE FUTURE, THE TWO POPULAR SIZES OF TIRES YOU HAVE BEEN BUYING WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

670/15 BLACK CUSTOM TBLs. "GOODYEAR" WHICH WERE \$14.50 ARE NOW \$14.93.

750/14 BLACK CUSTOM TBLs. "GOODYEAR" WHICH WERE \$14.50 ARE NOT \$14.93."

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

MR. WALKER TURNER, RIVERHEAD, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD. HE INQUIRED AS TO THE REASON WHY HE WAS DISCHARGED AS AN EMPLOYEE OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND WHY HE DID NOT RECEIVE HIS TWO WEEKS VACATION PAY.

MR. TURNER WAS ADVISED TO OBTAIN THE SERVICES OF AN ATTORNEY AND PROCEED THROUGH PROPER CHANNELS.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 24, 1960 FROM RESIDENTS OF WADING RIVER WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT HULSE LANDING ROAD, IN WADING RIVER, BE REPAIRED, AND FURTHER, THAT SIGNS AND MARKINGS FOR PARKING PURPOSES BE REPAINTED.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE HIGHWAY COMMITTEE.
COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

MR. J. KYLE, HEROD POINT, WADING RIVER, REPRESENTING HEROD'S POINT CIVIC ASSOCIATION APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE ROADS AT HEROD POINT AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.

MR. KYLE WAS INFORMED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD THAT THEY WOULD FAVORABLY CONSIDER THE TOWN SHARING THE ENGINEERING AND LEGAL COSTS BUT THAT THE AMOUNT OF THE TOWN'S SHARE WOULD BE LIMITED TO \$350.00.

THE BOARD INFORMED MR. KYLE FURTHER, THAT WHEN HE HAS INFORMED THE BOARD THAT THE CIVIC ASSOCIATION WOULD UNDERTAKE AND GUARANTY THE PAYMENT OF ANY PRELIMINARY EXPENSES OVER \$350.00, THEN THE BOARD WOULD TELL THE ENGINEER AND AN ATTORNEY TO PROCEED WITH THE MATTER.

OF COURSE, IF THE DISTRICT WAS SUCESSFULLY ORGANIZED AND EVENTUAL-
LY SET UP, THEN BOTH THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AND THE CIVIC ASSOCIATION WOULD BE REIMBURSED BY THE NEW DISTRICT.

MR. KYLE WAS FURTHER ADVISED THAT IT WOULD BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CIVIC ASSOCIATION TO OBTAIN THE REQUIRED SIGNATURES ON THE PETITION FOR THE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JUNE 2, 1960 FROM MR. DAVID K. KADANE, CHAIRMAN LEGAL COMMITTEE, NASSAU COUNTY COUNCIL OF BOY SCOUTS, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THEIR COMPLAINT AGAINST "OAK PARK TRAILER COURT", WADING RIVER. HE INQUIRED AS TO THE STATUS OF THEIR COMPLAINT.

WHEREAS IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD TO ESTABLISH A RECREATION PROJECT, AND

WHEREAS THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD IS ABOUT TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR SUCH A PROJECT TO THE NEW YORK STATE YOUTH COMMISSION FOR ITS APPROVAL, AND IF APPROVED, TO APPLY SUBSEQUENTLY TO THE STATE OF NEW YORK FOR PARTIAL REIMBURSEMENT OF FUNDS EXPENDED ON SAID PROJECT, AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER 556 OF THE LAWS OF 1945, AS AMENDED, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT ALL NECESSARY EXPENSES BE A TOWN CHARGE.

APPLICATIONS ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

WHEREAS EDWARD HAWKINS, OF SPEED-O-RAMA, INC., CORAM, N.Y., HAS APPLIED FOR A PERMIT FOR A DISPLAY OF FIREWORKS TO BE HELD ON JULY 2, 1960 AT THE RIVERHEAD RACEWAY, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., AND

WHEREAS EDWARD HAWKINS HAS FILED WITH THE TOWN CLERK A CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC LIABILITY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE INSURANCE NAMING THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, A SKETCH SHOWING THE LOCATION WHERE THE FIREWORKS ARE TO BE DISCHARGED, AND AN APPLICATION FROM THE SUFFOLK NOVELTY FIREWORKS COMPANY, BELLPORT, NEW YORK, THE FIRM IN CHARGE OF SETTING OFF OF SAID FIREWORKS, AND

WHEREAS THE TOWN ATTORNEY HAS READ AND APPROVED ALL PAPERS FILED IN THIS CONNECTION,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN CLERK BE AND HE IS HEREBY INSTRUCTED TO ISSUE A FIREWORKS PERMIT TO EDWARD HAWKINS, SPEED-O-RAMA, INC., CORAM, N.Y., FOR THE EVENING OF JULY 2, 1960, AND THAT THE PERMIT CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS AND PROVISIONS:

THAT THE ACTUAL POINT AT WHICH THE FIREWORKS ARE TO BE FIRED SHALL BE AT LEAST TWO HUNDRED FEET FROM THE NEAREST PERMANENT BUILDING, PUBLIC HIGHWAY OR RAILROAD OR OTHER MEANS OF TRAVEL AND AT LEAST FIFTY FEET FROM THE NEAREST ABOVE GROUND TELEPHONE OR TELEGRAPH LINE, TREE OR OTHER OVERHEAD OBSTRUCTIONS, THAT THE AUDIENCE AT SUCH DISPLAY SHALL BE RESTRAINED BEHIND LINES AT LEAST ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY FEET FROM THE POINT AT WHICH THE FIREWORKS ARE DISCHARGED AND ONLY PERSONS IN ACTIVE CHARGE OF THE DISPLAY SHALL BE ALLOWED INSIDE THESE LINES, THAT ALL FIREWORKS THAT FIRE A PROJECTILE SHALL BE SO SET UP THAT THE PROJECTILE WILL GO INTO THE AIR AS NEARBY AS POSSIBLE IN A VERTICAL DIRECTION, UNLESS SUCH FIREWORKS ARE TO BE FIRED FROM THE SHORE OF A LAKE OR OTHER LARGE BODY OF WATER, WHEN THEY MAY BE DIRECTED IN SUCH MANNER THAT THE FALLING RESIDUE FROM THE DEFLAGRATION WILL FALL INTO SUCH LAKE OR BODY OF WATER, THAT ANY FIREWORKS THAT REMAIN UNFIRED AFTER THE DISPLAY IS CONCLUDED SHALL BE IMMEDIATELY DISPOSED OF IN A WAY SAFE FOR THE PARTICULAR TYPE OF FIREWORKS REMAINING, THAT NO FIREWORKS SHALL BE HELD DURING ANY WIND STORM IN WHICH THE WIND REACHES A VELOCITY OR MORE THAN THIRTY MILES PER HOUR, THAT ALL THE PERSONS IN ACTUAL CHARGE OF FIRING THE FIREWORKS SHALL BE OVER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN YEARS, COMPETENT AND PHYSICALLY FIT FOR THE TASK, THAT THERE SHALL BE AT LEAST

TWO SUCH OPERATORS CONSTANTLY ON DUTY DURING THE DISCHARGE AND THAT AT LEAST TWO SODA ACID OR OTHER APPROVED TYPE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS OF AT LEAST TWO AND ONE-HALF GALLONS CAPACITY EACH SHALL BE KEPT AT AS WIDELY SEPARATED POINTS AS POSSIBLE WITHIN THE ACTUAL AREA OF THE DISPLAY.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.
