

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD
HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, JULY 5, 1960 AT 9:30 A. M.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD ON TUESDAY, JUNE 21, 1960 BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

POLICE REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE 1960 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING REPORTED ON THE MATTER OF THE ACQUISITION OF LAND AT EAST CREEK, JAMESPORT AND SUBMITTED A RESOLUTION RELATIVE THERETO.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED THAT ALDEN W. YOUNG, LICENSED ENGINEER AND SURVEYOR, BE AUTHORIZED AND EMPLOYED TO MAKE A PROPER SURVEY AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PREMISES, ADJACENT TO THE JAMESPORT PUBLIC BEACH PROPERTY OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, TO BE ACQUIRED FOR FURTHER PUBLIC RECREATION PURPOSES, AND THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED TO OBTAIN AN OPTION TO PURCHASE THE SAME FROM THE OWNERS THEREOF, TO ORDER A TITLE SEARCH SUBSEQUENTLY THERETO, AND TO PERFORM ANYTHING FURTHER IN PREPARING THE MATTER FOR FORMAL RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE PIKE REPORTED FURTHER ON THIS MATTER AND STATED THAT CONSIDERATION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE ACQUISITION OF THE GEORGE CONKLIN PARCEL SITUATE IN THE SAME AREA, EITHER BY PURCHASE OR CONDEMNATION.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JUNE 21, 1960 FROM LLOYD CASE, SECRETARY, RIVERHEAD FIRE DEPARTMENT, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"I HAVE BEEN DIRECTED BY THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS TO REPLY TO YOUR LETTER OF MAY 25, 1960, IN REFERENCE TO THE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICTS CONTRACT WHICH EXPIRES ON DECEMBER 31, 1960.

THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS WOULD ENTER INTO A CONTRACT TO SERVE THE AQUEBOGUE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, ROANOKE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AND CALVERTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT FOR THE PERIOD

JANUARY 1, 1961 TO DECEMBER 31, 1961 FOR SUM OF \$7,000.00

JANUARY 1, 1962 TO DECEMBER 31, 1962 FOR SUM OF \$7,500.00

JANUARY 1, 1963 TO DECEMBER 31, 1963 FOR SUM OF \$8,000.00

PROVIDED THAT THE FIREMEN OF THE RIVERHEAD FIRE DEPARTMENT AGREE TO SERVE AFORESAID DISTRICTS, WHICH ASSENT OR DENIAL WILL BE RECEIVED FROM THE RIVERHEAD DEPARTMENT ON OR ABOUT JULY 13, 1960." END.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE OFFER OF THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS OF THE RIVERHEAD FIRE DEPARTMENT TO SERVE THE AQUEBOGUE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, ROANOKE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AND CALVERTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT FOR THE PERIOD OF 1/1/61 TO 12/31/61 FOR THE SUM OF \$7,000.00, FOR THE PERIOD OF 1/1/62 TO 12/31/62 FOR THE SUM OF \$7,500.00, FOR THE PERIOD OF 1/1/63 TO 12/31/63 FOR THE SUM OF \$8,000.00, BE ACCEPTED.

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN ATTORNEY PREPARE A CONTRACT TO EFFECT SAME, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE FIREMEN OF THE RIVERHEAD FIRE DEPARTMENT AND SUBJECT TO A PUBLIC HEARING AS REQUIRED BY LAW.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MR. SEYMOUR STANTON, CALVERTON, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO COMPLAINTS TO THE BOARD ABOUT HIS CONDUCTING A BOATING BUSINESS ON TOWN OWNED PROPERTY ON OLD RIVER ROAD.

HE WAS ADVISED BY THE BOARD TO CEASE ALL OPERATIONS ON TOWN OWNED PROPERTY.

MR. L. S. THOMAS, REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DUAL PARKING METER COMPANY, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE PURCHASE OF NEW PARKING METERS.

HE DEMONSTRATED THE VARIOUS METERS MADE BY THE DUAL PARKING METER COMPANY AND RECOMMENDED THE PURCHASE OF AUTOMATIC PARKING METERS TO REPLACE THE PRESENT MANUAL METERS.

HE QUOTED THE FOLLOWING:

"TO FURNISH AND INSTALL ON DESIGNATED STANCHIONS THREE (3) HUNDRED MORE OR LESS MODEL M3 MANUAL OR MODEL GS4A AUTOMATIC PARKING METERS, SET FOR A ONE OR TWO HOUR PARKING LIMIT AND CAPABLE OF OPERATING ON PENNIES, DIMES AND NICHELS AT THE FOLLOWING PRICES.

PAYMENT:

TO BE MADE BY OR FROM THE ADDITIONAL REVENUE EARNED BY THE USE OF NEW, EFFICIENT METERS. THIS ADDITIONAL REVENUE TO BE COMPUTED BY COMPARING THE NEW METER INCOME, MONTH BY MONTH WITH THE LIKE MONTHS OF 1959."

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

MATTER TABLED FOR FURTHER STUDY.

MR. ALBERT EISENSTADT AND MR. EUGENE ALBERT, REPRESENTING THE MERCHANTS DIVISION OF THE RIVERHEAD CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD REQUESTING PERMISSION TO CLOSE TO VEHICLE TRAFFIC, MAIN STREET FROM ROANOKE AVENUE TO EAST AVENUE, FROM SUNDAY EVENING AUGUST 14TH TO THURSDAY MORNING, AUGUST 18TH.

BEING THE WEEK OF THE ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE PLANS TO SET UP A MALL IN SAID SECTION OF MAIN STREET AND PROVIDE AN ATTRACTIVE FESTIVE DISPLAY AS AN ADDED ATTRACTION FOR THE MANY VISITERS EXPECTED THAT WEEK.

IT IS THE PLAN OF THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TO DETOUR VEHICLE TRAFFIC BY WAY OF EAST AVENUE AND SECOND STREET AND MR. EISENSTADT AND MR. ALBERT REQUESTED THE COOPERATION OF THE BOARD IN THIS VENTURE.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THEY FULLY COOPERATE WITH THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE PROVIDED THE CHAMBER RECEIVED PERMISSION FROM THE STATE TRAFFIC COMMISSION TO CLOSE OFF SAID SECTION OF MAIN STREET, MAIN STREET BEING A STATE HIGHWAY.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTALS OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$6,381.61 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$13,449.55. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS ON MOTION AND VOTE, THE MEETING ADJOURNED TO MEET ON JULY 19, 1960 AT 9:30 A. M.
