A COMMUNICATION DATED NOVEMBER 10, 1960 FROM RECREATION DIRECTOR  
KENNETH G. ROWLAND WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"IN RESPONSE TO THE RECENT LETTER FROM THE  
LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS MAY I OFFER THE FOLLOW-  
ING INFORMATION.

ENROLLED PARTICIPANTS FROM JANUARY 11 TO  
SEPTEMBER 30, 1960 IN THE RECREATION PROGRAM  
IS LISTED AT 940 INDIVIDUALS. DURING THIS  
TIME SPAN WE HAVE HAD 10,928 PARTICIPANTS AND  
11,224 SPECTATORS FOR A TOTAL ATTENDANCE OF  
22,152 AT RECREATION DEPARTMENT SPONSORED  
ACTIVITIES. WE EXPECT A TOTAL OF 25,000 AT  
THE END OF THIS YEAR.

THE SUGGESTION OF THE LEAGUE IS WELL TAKEN  
BY THIS DEPARTMENT AND WE WILL EARNESTLY  
STRIVE TO BETTER THE PROGRAM IN BOTH QUANTITY  
AND QUALITY. I WILL CONTACT THE LEAGUE TO  
SEE IF THEY HAVE SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES IN MIND  
THAT HAVE NOT COME TO THE RECREATION DEPART-  
MENT THAT THE PEOPLE OF RIVERHEAD DESIRE."

MR. WICKHAM TYTE APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD RELATIVE TO HIS APPLICATION FOR THE INSTALLATION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS ALONG HUBBARD AVENUE.

HE STATED THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WAS RE-GRADING THE HIGHWAY ADJACENT TO HIS PROPERTY AND THE RE-GRADING HAS CREATED A NEW PARKING PROBLEM IN FRONT OF HIS BUSINESS BUILDING.

HE ASKED THE TOWN BOARD TO WAIVE ALL OR PART OF HIS COST FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SAID CURBS AND GUTTERS.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT NO PART OF MR. TYTE'S COST BE WAIVED.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED ALONG HUBBARD AVENUE, ADJACENT TO THE PROPERTY OF WICKHAM C. TYTE AND OLIVER W. HUBBARD, PURSUANT TO A CONTRACT, THE FORM OF WHICH IS HERETO ANNEXED.

CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND GUTTERS

TOWN HIGHWAY

THIS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, AND WICKHAM C. TYTE AND OLIVER W. HUBBARD, OF RIVERHEAD, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS.

THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AGREES TO CONSTRUCT CURBS AND GUTTERS ALONG HUBBARD AVENUE, A TOWN HIGHWAY IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.
2. THE GRADES AND LINES WILL BE ESTABLISHED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
3. THE MATERIALS WILL BE DELIVERED AND THE LABOR PERFORMED AT TIMES AND IN A FORM AND MANNER SPECIFIED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
4. THE TIME OF COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF THE WORK SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.
5. ALL LABOR USED AND ALL MATERIALS FURNISHED SHALL CONFORM TO NEW YORK STATE SPECIFICATIONS.
6. THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CURBS AND GUTTERS SHALL BE THE OBLIGATION OF THE TOWN.
7. THE ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNER, IN CONSIDERATION OF THESE PRESENTS AND OTHER CONSIDERATIONS HEREIN PERFORMED AND TO BE PERFORMED BY SAID TOWN, DOES HEREWITH PAY TO THE SAID TOWN THE FOLLOWING SUMS:

WICKHAM C. TYTE-----\$120.00

OLIVER W. HUBBARD---\$150.00

WHICH IS THE SUM TO REIMBURSE THE TOWN FOR THE COST OF THE MATERIALS.

THAT THE EXPENSE TO THE TOWN SHALL NOT EXCEED THE SUM OF \$810.00

THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN THE SAID CONTRACT IN BEHALF OF THE TOWN WHEN THE MONEY TO BE PAID BY SAID WICKHAM C. TYTE AND OLIVER W. HUBBARD IS TURNED OVER AND THE CONTRACT HAS BEEN SIGNED BY THEM, AND THEN

THAT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS BE DIRECTED TO PERFORM THE WORK.

RESOLVED THAT A PUBLIC HEARING BE HELD ON THE 6TH DAY OF DECEMBER 1960, AT THE TOWN HALL AT 11:00 O'CLOCK A.M. FOR THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING TOWN ORDINANCE No. 13 (PARKING METER ORDINANCE) OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE AMENDMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED ARE AS FOLLOWS:

ADD TO SECTION 1-A "EXCEPT FOR DEVICES MOVED BY HUMAN POWER".

ADD TO SECTION 2: THE FOLLOWING HOLIDAYS: "COLUMBUS DAY AND ELECTION DAY AND CHANGE ARMISTICE DAY TO VETERANS' DAY."

AMEND SECTION 7: TO STRAIGHT NICKEL AND TIME ELEMENT TO TWO HOURS IN AGREED AREAS.

AMEND SECTION 7-A: "FROM 30 MINUTES FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES TO THE TIME WHILE ACTUALLY ENGAGED IN LOADING OR UNLOADING CARGO, MERCHANDISE OR PASSENGERS."

ADD NEW SECTION 7-B: THAT ALL COMMERCIAL VEHICLES SHALL USE DESIGNATED LOADING ZONES WHENEVER PRACTICAL.

AMEND SECTION 12-D: "POLICE CLERK TO POLICE CLERK OR JUSTICE CLERK."

FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN CLERK GIVE NOTICE OF SUCH HEARING BY THE PUBLICATION OF A NOTICE IN THE NEWS-REVIEW, THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE TOWN, SPECIFYING THE TIME WHEN AND THE PLACE WHERE SUCH HEARING WILL BE HELD, AND IN GENERAL TERMS DESCRIBING THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS AND CHANGES TO THE ORDINANCE, AND SUCH NOTICE SHALL BE PUBLISHED ONCE AT LEAST TEN DAYS PRIOR TO THE DAY SPECIFIED FOR SUCH HEARING.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, ABSENT, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENEED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTALS OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$5,125.84 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$1,558.08. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, ABSENT, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS ON MOTION AND VOTE, THE MEETING ADJOURNED, TO MEET ON TUESDAY, DECEMBER 6, 1960 AT 9:30 A. M.
