COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS  
SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD  
ON NOVEMBER 1, 9, 14 AND 15, 1960 BE APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES,  
JUSTICE PIKE, ABSENT, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD,  
YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

ATTORNEY SAMUEL L. HAYS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD A "DEED OF  
DEDICATION" FROM THE RIVERHEAD SAVINGS BANK FOR A PARCEL OF LAND  
FOR HIGHWAY PURPOSES, ADJACENT TO ITS PROPERTY ON THE SOUTHWEST  
CORNER OF MAIN STREET AND PECONIC AVENUE.

"DEED OF DEDICATION" ORDERED FILED.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE TOWN ATTORNEY TO PREPARE RESOLUTION  
OF TOWN BOARD ACCEPTING SAME AND ORDER LAYING OUT HIGHWAY BY THE  
SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.

ATTORNEY SAMUEL L. HAYS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD THE FOLLOWING  
COMMUNICATION.

"AS YOU ARE AWARE, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT IS BUILDING  
A JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL ON THE SCHOOL PROPERTY ON  
HARRISON AVENUE, NORTH OF THE ATHLETIC FIELD.

ONE OF THE MAJOR PROBLEMS FACING THE DISTRICT IS  
THE DISPOSAL OF THE STORM WATER WHICH DRAINS OFF  
FROM THE SCHOOL SITE. THE ROOFS AND PAVED AREAS  
COLLECT THE WATER WHICH FORMERLY SOAKED INTO THE  
GROUND, AND THIS COLLECTED WATER MUST BE DISPOSED  
OF.

AFTER A CONSULTATION WITH THE COUNTY DEPARTMENT  
OF PUBLIC WORKS AUTHORITIES, A PLAN WAS DEVISED  
WHEREBY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT WOULD RUN A STORM  
SEWER THROUGH THE COUNTY'S RIGHT-OF-WAY ON

CRANBERRY STREET, AND THE WATER WOULD FLOW INTO MERRITTS POND. THE COUNTY AGREED TO CONSTRUCT THE STORM SEWER FROM ROANOKE AVENUE INTO MERRITTS POND AND TO CONSTRUCT THE STORM SEWER ACROSS ROANOKE AVENUE.

ROANOKE AVENUE, AT THIS POINT, HAS A COMPLEX OF PIPES UNDERNEATH ITS SURFACE WHICH MUST BE RECKONED WITH IN CARRYING THE STORM SEWER ACROSS ROANOKE AVENUE. THE COUNTY HAS STATED A CONDITION TO ITS PLAN THAT THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE SEWER DISTRICT AND THE RIVERHEAD WATER DISTRICT MUST BEAR THE COST OF BY-PASSING THESE VARIOUS PIPES. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT APPEARS BEFORE YOU TO REQUEST THE COOPERATION OF THE SEWER DISTRICT IN GETTING THE STORM SEWER ACROSS ROANOKE AVENUE. THE SCHOOL BOARD REALIZES IT MUST BEAR THE MAJOR EXPENSES IN MAKING THIS OFFSET CONNECTION. WE WOULD LIKE YOU TO CONSIDER WHATEVER AID YOU CAN GIVE TO THE SCHOOL BOARD IN GETTING THE STORM SEWER AROUND THIS MAZE OF PIPES IN ROANOKE AVE."

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN BOARD AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE RIVERHEAD SEWER DISTRICT AND THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE RIVERHEAD WATER DISTRICT TO AID AND ADVISE THE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 OF THE TOWNS OF RIVERHEAD, SOUTHAMPTON AND BROOKHAVEN, IN THE DESIGN OF AND CONSTRUCTION OF A STORM SEWER ACROSS ROANOKE AVENUE SO AS TO CONNECT THE EASTERN TERMINAL OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY STORM SEWER WHICH IS TO BE CONSTRUCTED TO CARRY OFF THE STORM WATER FROM THE RIVERHEAD JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL AT NO EXPENSE TO THE TOWN.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, ABSENT, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

MR. JOSEPH FOOHEY, SOUND SHORE ROAD, RIVERHEAD, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD.

HE COMPLAINED ABOUT THE NOISE CAUSED BY GO-CARTS, OPERATING ON THE GO-CART TRACK RECENTLY ESTABLISHED AT THE PIER AVENUE PUBLIC BEACH PARKING AREA.

HE STATED THAT A GO-CART TRACK, PROPERLY SUPERVISED, IS A WELCOME ADDITION TO THE TOWN RECREATION PROGRAM, BUT HE FELT THAT THE PRESENT TRACK DIMINISHED PROPERTY VALUES IN THE AREA AND MADE A MOCKERY OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE RECREATION COMMITTEE FOR STUDY AND REPORT.

A COMMUNICATION DATED DECEMBER 1, 1960 FROM THE RECREATION COMMISSION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSTITUTION OF THE RIVERHEAD RECREATION COMMISSION, AND A

RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE TOWN BOARD ON JANUARY 5, 1960, THE TERM OF LAURENCE F. SCUDDER ON SAID COMMISSION EXPIRES ON DECEMBER 31 OF THIS YEAR. THE COMMISSION HAS NOMINATED AND APPROVED DONALD BARTH OF NEWTON AVENUE, RIVERHEAD FOR MEMBERSHIP TO THE RECREATION COMMISSION FOR A TERM OF 5 YEARS BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1961.

WE SEEK APPROVAL AND A RESOLUTION TO THIS EFFECT." END.

PROOF OF PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ORDERED FILED. SUPERVISOR LEONARD DECLARED THE HEARING OPEN TO ANYONE WISHING TO BE HEARD IN FAVOR OF OR OBJECTING TO THE ADOPTION OF THE AMENDMENTS AND CHANGES TO SAID ORDINANCE No. 13.

MR. WILLIAM BUZ, REPRESENTING THE RIVERHEAD CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD.

HE STATED THAT THE CHAMBER WAS NOT OPPOSED TO THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE PARKING METER ORDINANCE. HE FURTHER STATED, HOWEVER, THAT THE CHAMBER WISHED HIM TO SUGGEST TO THE TOWN BOARD THAT METER FUNDS BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR A SURVEY OF THE PECONIC AVENUE ENTRANCE TO THE TOWN PARKING FIELD IN THE HOPE THAT THIS ENTRANCE COULD BE WIDENED.

MATTER TO BE CONSIDERED.

PETITION ORDERED FILED.

NO ONE ELSE WISHING TO BE HEARD AND NO OTHER COMMUNICATIONS HAVING BEEN RECEIVED, SUPERVISOR LEONARD DECLARED THE HEARING CLOSED.

AT THIS POINT IN THE MEETING SUPERVISOR LEONARD STATED THAT THE BOARD WOULD GO INTO A SHORT EXECUTIVE SESSION AND THEN RECONVENE FOR FURTHER BUSINESS.

AT 11:40 A. M., AFTER SHORT EXECUTIVE SESSION, THE BOARD RE-CONVENED WITH ALL MEMBERS OF THE BOARD PRESENT WITH THE EXCEPTION OF JUSTICE OTIS G. PIKE.

AMEND SECTION 7-A: "FROM 30 MINUTES FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES TO THE TIME WHILE ACTUALLY ENGAGED IN LOADING OR UNLOADING CARGO, MERCHANDISE OR PASSENGERS."

ADD NEW SECTION 7-B: "THAT ALL COMMERCIAL VEHICLES SHALL USE DESIGNATED LOADING ZONES WHENEVER PRACTICAL."

AMEND SECTION 12-D: "POLICE CLERK TO: POLICE CLERK OR JUSTICE CLERK."
