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Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, February 3, 1953 at 2:00 p.m.

Thomas M. Stark, Town Attorney, and Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways, were also present.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Justice William J. Leonard be duly appointed chairman for this meeting. The Vote, Justices, Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 20, 1953 were read and on motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the minutes be adopted as read. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police report for the month of January, 1953, was submitted to the Board, and was ordered placed on file.

A communication dated January 26, 1953, was read from Supervisor Kelly certifying that he had received from Charles A. Horton, Tax Receiver, Town of Riverhead, the following sums of money on account of Tax Collections of the 1952-53 Tax Warrant, as follows: School Districts-\$150,000.00; Maintenance of Highways-\$50,000.00; General Town Purposes-\$30,000.00; Sewer Maintenance District-\$40,000.00; Lighting Districts-\$10,000.00; Town Welfare-\$5,000.00; Riverhead Town Civilian Defense-\$1,000.00. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Charles A. Horton, Tax Receiver of the Town of Riverhead, submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of February 2, 1953, and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Bids for the purchase of a new police car were received from Vail Motor Corp., McDonly Motor Sales and George Morell. The bids were ordered to be placed on the calendar for Feb. 17.

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On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that Horace A. Demarest, Jr., be and he hereby is appointed special attorney to the Town of Riverhead for the purpose of securing property at the Iron Pier Beach and South Jamesport Beach for public beaches and said attorney is hereby given the authority to obtain the necessary abstracts of title regarding this property. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that purchase be made from McDonly Motor Sales of one (1) 1953, four door, six cylinder, DeSoto sedan for the Superintendent of Highways in the net amount of \$2252.00 plus trade in allowance of \$761.40. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that consent be and the same is hereby given to the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead to make an order laying out the continuation West of Silvan Drive, and Oakwood Drive, and Deane Street and Howard Street, all of which lands are more particularly described in a certain deed of dedication from Dewey Lewin to the Town of Riverhead dated January 20, 1953, for highway purposes, in accordance with the provisions of the highway roads and other statutes applicable thereto. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that Patrolman William J. Danowski be authorized to use the Town Highway Pickup to go to the Bronx, New York, on February 4, 1953 for the purpose of bringing back the new scooter, and that all necessary expenses be paid by the Town. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund--\$3558.40; and Highway Machinery Fund--\$5172.36.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, February 17, 1953 at 2:00 p.m.
