

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Tuesday, February 8th. 1927 at 2 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Supt. of Highways, was present.

The minutes of the Meeting of January 26th. were read and on motion adopted.

The Town Clerk read a letter from St. Peters Hospital of Brooklyn, N.Y. acknowledging receipt of donation of Riverhead Town and thanking Town for said donation.

On motion and vote the communication was ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Howell advised the Board that he had received a protest from the Riverhead Town Agricultural Society protesting against the Building Program of the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County.

Counselor Cecil B. Tooker addressed the Board and advised that in accordance with the instructions of Supt. of Highways Charles O. Downs, Surveyor Daniel R. Young and himself had gone to Southold to look up the record of the North Road, but they were unable to find any record of this Highway.

On motion and vote Supt. of Highways Charles O. Downs was authorized to define the North Country Road from Sound Avenue to Wading River as a four rod road, furnishing the Town Board with a survey and an order laying out said North Country Road, after which the Town Board would accept same as a Highway.

The legal opinion regarding the right of the Town Board to increase the salary of the present Tax Receiver while holding office was brought to the attention of the Board.

On motion and vote the matter of increased compensation for the Tax Receiver was held over for the next Town Board Meeting.

A letter written by William L. Miller of Wading River to Mr. Robinson proposing that the Town lease certain marsh land and fill same in for parking space at Wading

River was read by Supervisor Howell. This letter had been referred by Mr. Robinson to Supervisor Howell, asking what the Town Board would do in this matter. The opinion of the Town Board was that the Town should take no action on this proposition.

On motion and vote the Tax Receiver was authorized to continue his clerk for an additional two weeks at the present salary.

Meeting adjourned to meet again February 19th. 1927 at 12.00 o'clock noon.
