

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, June 2, 1953 at 2:00 P.M.

Thomas M. Stark, Town Attorney, and Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways, were also present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 19, 1953 were read and on motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Yousik it was resolved that the minutes be adopted as read. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read to the Board by Edwin S. Lapham on behalf of the Wading River Civic Association requesting additional Policeman at the Wading River Landing for the summer on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays. The Communication was ordered placed on file and the matter referred to the Chairman of the Police Committee, Austin H. Warner.

Edwin S. Lapham, also read another communication from the Wading River Civic Association regarding the abandonment of a portion of the Sound Road in Wading River, known as the Landing, North side of Creek Road to the Sound, for Park District. The matter was referred to Thomas M. Stark, Town Attorney.

A communication dated May 22, 1953 was read from Mrs. George Wiesen, Riverhead, disapproving the establishment of Roanoke Avenue as a one way street. The communication was placed on file.

A communication under date of May 28th from William J. Hattrick, Attorney and Counsellor at Law, Riverhead, was read to the Board to ascertain if it was necessary to obtain a permit for the storage of combustibles of the type usually kept at gas stations. The communication was ordered placed on file, and on motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Leonard, it was Resolved that at the request of William J. Hattrick, under letter of May 28th representing Joseph Twomey, Calverton, N.Y. that a permit for storage of combustibles be granted subject to the Riverhead Town Fire Ordinances. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Isadore Danowski tendering his resignation as School Traffic Officer effective as of May 16, 1953. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the resignation of Isadore Danowski, School Traffic Officer Calverton, New York, be accepted as of May 16, 1953. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Arthur A. Dort tendering his resignation as School Traffic Officer effective as of May 12, 1953. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the resignation of Arthur A. Dort, School Traffic Officer Aquebogue, New York, be accepted as of May 12, 1953. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police report for the month of May 1953 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's report for the month of May 1953 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Charles Allen Horton, Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead, submitted his report of the amount of taxes collected as of June 2, 1953 and the report was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Edward Schuster requesting permission for the Hunt Bros. Circus to use the Fairground property for the day of Tuesday, July 7, 1953, being the same area as used heretofore. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the request of the Hunt Bros. Circus for permission to use the Fair Ground property on Tuesday, July 7, 1953 be granted, subject to the rules and regulations governing the use of Town controlled property for bazaars, carnivals and circuses. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Roscoe C. Palmer, Jr. of Riverhead, N.Y. be and he hereby is appointed part time patrolman of the Riverhead Police Department, said appointment to take effect retroactive May 22, 1953, and that he be compensated at the rate of \$1.50 per hour, subject to the rules and regulations of Suffolk County Civil Service Commission. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

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On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead enter into a contract dated May 26, 1953 submitted by Fenimore Meyer, Riverhead, New York, for the purchase by said Town from said Fenimore Meyer of two parcels of real property constituting a portion of the premises to be acquired on the South side of East Main Street for public parking fields, and the Supervisor is hereby empowered to execute said contract on behalf of the Town of Riverhead. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Proof of publication of notice for purchase of one Tractor-Mower for the Highway Department was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

On motion by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Charles W. Gatz be empowered to hire Special Clerk to the Board of Assessors. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

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The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund--\$1362.79 and Highway Machinery Fund--\$700.37.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, June 16, 1953 at 10:00 A.M.
