#282 REQUESTS ASSISTANCE FROM COUNTY EXECUTIVE RE: 414 E. MAIN STREET

#283 OBJECTS TO BUDGET CUT OF FUNDS FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO ROUTE 58
Councilman Menendez offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Lombardi.

WHEREAS, the plans for the widening of Route 58, Town of Riverhead, have been in the planning stage for several years, and

WHEREAS, this Town Board feels that it is in the best interest of all citizens to establish a safer, faster passage to the north fork of Suffolk County by widening Route 58, and that no improvements have been made since 1936, and

WHEREAS, this Board has been informed that funds allocated for the widening of Route 58 have been cut from the County budget,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

That this Town Board does hereby urge the County Legislature of the County of Suffolk to reconsider and replace the allocation of funds necessary to implement the plan to widen Route 58, Riverhead
