

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday June 29th 1932 at 7:30 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Town Board meeting and of the Special Town Board meeting held June 8th 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication was read from Van Rensselaer Skidmore Post No.2476 - Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Inc., expressing the thanks of the post for assisting at the installation of the officers of said Post. Communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Bagatelle Nursery of Huntington Station, N.Y., asking that it be furnished with specifications for any shrubbery planting that the Town may contemplate in the future was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Littlefield Alger Signal Co., relative to the traffic signal control in use at the intersection of Second Street and Roanoke Avenue, was read and referred to the Lighting Committee.

A communication was read from Frank Haupt of South Jamesport, N.Y., advising that posts and a fence had been taken down by the Highway Department when a highway was opened up at South Jamesport and enclosed a bill in the amount of \$6.11 for replacement of said posts. This communication and bill were referred to the Highway Committee.

A request from Father Schimmel for curbs and gutters on Pulaski Street and Sweezy Avenue at the Church property was referred to the Sup't. of Highways.

Justice Rubenstein, reporting for the Police Committee recommended that Special Constables be compensated at the rate of \$5.40 per day for an eight hour day, the Special

Constables using a motorcycle be allowed an additional \$2.00 per day for the use of the motorcycle and the Special Constable on duty at Police Headquarters be compensated at the present rate of \$4.80 per day/

On motion duly and seconded, it was Resolved That Special Constables be compensated at the rate of \$5.40 per day of eight hours, with the exception of the Special Constable on duty at Police Headquarters whose compensation shall be \$4.80 per day and be it further Resolved That the Special Constable using a motorcycle shall be allowed an additional \$2.00 per day for expenses of said motorcycle:

The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

Justice Rubenstein, reporting for the Police Committee, suggested that the Two Hour Parking Ordinance be enforced.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the Police Committee be authorized to make any changes necessary in the Parking Regulations, advertise said regulations and take the steps necessary to enforce the Two Hour Parking Regulation.

Justice Rubenstein, reporting for the Committee on Hawking and Peddling presented a resolution and requested that the Board specify the license fees for Hawkers and Peddlers.

Raymond H. Vail, addressed the Board advising that in his opinion the annual fee for Hawkers and Peddlers should be \$100.00 in order to protect the local merchants.

On motion duly made and seconded it was Resolved That pursuant to Article 10, Section 210 of the Town Law, the hawking and peddling of goods or produce other than meats, fish, fruit or farm produce in public streets or places, or

the vending of the same by calls from house to house without a license in the Town of Riverhead is hereby prohibited.

Further Resolved That the violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$25.00

Further Resolved That the license fees for Hawkers and Peddlers as above set forth shall be as follows:-

Per Year \$100.00

Per 3 Months \$50.00

Per 6 Months \$75.00

The resolution was thereupon declared carried.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of \$5000.00 to pay on account of audited bills of June 28th 1932.

Attorney Cecil B. Tooker, representing A. A. Tuthill, addressed the Board and requested that the Town do no further work on the road running west from Landing Road to Wading River Creek across the lands of A.A.Tuthill until the status of this road could be determined. This matter was referred to the Highway Committee and Sup't. of Highways.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet on July 13th 1932 at 2 P.M.
