

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday August 10th 1932 at 2 P.M.

Raymond S. Welch, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

Minutes of the regular Town Board Meeting and of the Special Town Board meeting held July 27th 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication from Mr. Edwin C. Duryea, a resident of South Jamesport, N.Y., was read calling the attention of the Board, to the fact that Third Street had not been opened up, that the work of opening this highway had been started and left in a dangerous condition, and that he had started to build a house on a lot supposed to be bounded by Third Street but that he was hardly able to get to his land from the highway, and requesting that this matter be given prompt attention. This matter was referred to the Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways for investigation.

A communication was received from Harri Micah Howell, Attorney for Taska Holtja, who claims to have been injured by falling in a gutter at the corner of Roanoke Avenue and Main Street, enclosing bill for \$20.00 for one weeks wages for said Taska Holtja. This matter was referred to Justice Stackpole and Justice Frederick for investigation.

A communication was read from Littlefield Alger Signal Company, calling the attention of the Board to the dangerous conditions existing at the bridge over the Long Island Railroad on Route # 25 and submitting a plan to correct this condition by the installation of two flashing units and signs, the cost installed being \$165.00 per unit and sign. This matter was referred to the Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways for investigation.

The Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways

reporting on the request that the curb on West Main Street be lowered, advised that this work could be done by constructing a step in the existing curb and recommended that this work be done if sufficient money was available in the fund of this work.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this Board recommend to the Superintendent of Highways that the curb on the northerly side of West Main Street in front of the Garden Restaurant and vicinity be lowered by cutting a step in the existing curb.

The Highway Committee reporting on the Quit Claim Deeds to the Town of Riverhead, by William Cammerer and Sarah Cammerer, his wife, by George C. Young and Blanche Young, his wife, by Robert Wells and by William A. Brown, for certain lands in order to straighten out Hubbard Avenue recommended that the Deeds be accepted by the Town Board and that the Town Board authorize the payment of \$300.00 to William A. Brown for land deeded to the Town of Riverhead.

On motion duly made and seconded, it was Resolved That this Board accept Quit Claim Deeds from William Cammerer and Sarah Cammerer, his wife, by George C. Young and Blanche Young, his wife, by Robert Wells and by William A. Brown and be it further Resolved That the Supervisor of the Town of Riverhead be and he hereby is authorized and directed to pay the sum of \$300.00 to William A. Brown for land so deeded to the Town of Riverhead.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly carried.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town Clerk be and he hereby is authorized and directed to have Quit Claim Deeds in connection with Hubbard Avenue, filed in the Office of the County Clerk of Suffolk County.

The Audited Bills Committee reporting on the bills of Dr. Vincent A. Doroszka and the State X Ray Laboratory Service, being bills numbered 8165 for \$9.00, Bill 8166 for \$8.00 and Bill 8167 for \$50.00 advised that the bills were in order and recommended that the Board authorize the payment of same.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay bills of Dr. Vincent A. Doroszka and the State X Ray Laboratory being bill No. 8165 in the amount of \$9.00, Bill No. 8166 in the amount of \$8.00 and Bill No. 8167 in the amount of \$50.00

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, August 31, 1932 at 7:30 P.M.
