

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 6, 1944 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on August 23, 1944 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner

WHEREAS events presently indicate and point to an early ending and termination of the World Conflict in Europe and

WHEREAS the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead in behalf of its inhabitants believes that the coming of peace in this part of the earth should be appropriately observed by the giving of thanks and the offering of prayer

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That upon official and confirmed report of the ending of the European Conflict and of Allied Victory there being received that proper and appropriate announcement be made by the blowing of whistles and the ringing of bells and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such blowing of whistles and ringing of bells be a summons and invitation to all organizations and individuals of the Town of Riverhead and Riverside to participate at a meeting to be held in the front of the grand stand in the rear of the Pulaski Street School to give thanks and to offer prayer in observance of that victorious and grateful occasion. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was RESOLVED that L. Gilson Griffing, Charles Conklin and Isadore Danowski be and they hereby are appointed School Traffic Officers for the Town of Riverhead and be it further

RESOLVED that they serve at the pleasure of the Town Board from the hours of 8:00 A.M. to 9:00 A.M., 11:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M., and 3:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M., salary fixed at the rate of 75 cents per hour. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Smith Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police and Welfare reports for the month of August 1944 were sub-

mitted to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, September 30, 1944 at 3:00 P.M.
