

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the
Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednes-
day, August 31, 1932 at 7:30 P.M.

Present

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held
August 10, 1932 were read and on motion and vote duly
adopted.

A communication was read from the Automatic Voting
Machine Corporation of Jamestown, N.Y., advising that if
additional voting machines would be needed for the
Election this Fall, that the order should be placed
as soon as possible in order to insure delivery. This
letter was ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Riverhead Water District
by Ellis S. Duvall, Secretary, was read advising the
Board of the sum necessary to be raised by taxation
for the Riverhead and Roanoke Heights Extension
Water districts.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was
Resolved That the communication from the Riverhead
Water District relative to the sum necessary to be
raised by taxation be received and that a representa-
tive of the Board of Water Commissioners be requested
to come before the Town Board at its next meeting,
and advise if it would be possible to reduce the
amount of money to be raised by taxation by having
the District pay a portion of the commissioners salaries
and retirement of bonds and interest thereon, from receipts
received by the Districts for water rental.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was
Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and
they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon
certificate of indebtedness, the sum of Five Thousand

(\$5,000.00) Dollars, to pay on account of Audited Bills of August 30th 1932.

The Lighting Committee, reporting on the request of Gus Brooks, for an additional street light on Sweezy Avenue, reported having inspected this condition and recommended that an 80 C.P. street light be installed south of No.334 Sweezy Avenue, within the Riverhead Lighting District.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the report of the Lighting Committee be received and that the Long Island Lighting Company be notified to install one 80 C.P. street light on Sweezy Avenue, just south of No.334 Sweezy Avenue, within the Riverhead Lighting District.

Supervisor Homan requested the Lighting Committee to make a survey of the needs of the Lighting Districts for the coming year previous to making up the Budgets for the Lighting Districts.

Justice Stackpole reporting for the Committee in the Taska Holtja claim for \$20.00 damages, advised that said Taska Holtja would sign a General Release, releasing the Town of Riverhead, upon payment of \$20.00 damages by the Town of Riverhead, and that the Release was being prepared to settle the claim.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was Resolved That the following places be and they hereby are designated as Polling Places for the Election Districts designated in the Town of Riverhead, for the ensuing year.

- District No.1 School House at Wading River, N.Y.
School District No.1.
- District No.3. H. E. Campbell's Salesroom, West Main Street, Riverhead, N.Y.
- District No.4. Town Clerk's Office, Riverhead, N.Y.
- District No.5. Fire Department Headquarters, Riverhead, NY
- District No.6 Town Board meeting Room, Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, N.Y.
- District No.7 School House, Aquebogue, N.Y.
- District No.8 School House, Jamesport, N.Y.

As it was not known whether the remodeled Fire House on Hamilton Avenue, was suitable for a Polling Place, it

was moved, seconded and carried that the Supervisor appoint a Committee, to investigate, with power to designate the Polling Place in the Second District, and report to the Town Clerk the Polling Place so designated.

Supervisor Homan appointed Justice Rubenstein a committee to investigate the matter of a Polling Place in the Second District with power to designate said Polling Place.

Mr. John T. Hill, addressed the Board, calling the attention of the Board to the number of men out of work and asking that steps be taken to have the State take over Old Country Road and open same thereby giving employment to men out of work.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on September 14, 1932 at 2 P.M.
