

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 4, 1944 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on September 20, 1944 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Mr Sylvester Willmott, Proprietor of the Riverhead Community Service Station commending the Riverhead Police and especially Patrolman Bowden for the excellent service rendered in clearing up a serious infraction of the law which was committed at his place of business. The communication was ordered placed on file.

The Police and Welfare reports for the month of September were submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were accepted and ordered placed on file.

Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways addressed the Board and advised that the cost of damage caused by the recent hurricane would be about \$3000.00 and asked the Board to provide a fund to cover that amount.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to borrow on certificates of indebtedness the sum of \$3000.00 for the purpose of paying for the damage caused by the hurricane. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Smith Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Pursuant to Section 111 of the Town Law, detailed estimates of the amount of revenues to be received and the amount of expenditures to be made during the next fiscal year for every administrative officer, board, department and commission of the Town of Riverhead was submitted to the Town Board as follows:

On motion made by Justice Warner and Seconded by Justice Smith, it was Resolved, that this Town Board does hereby prepare and approve as the preliminary budget of this Town for the fiscal year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1945, the foregoing itemized statement of estimated revenues and expenditures and made a part of this resolution, and be it

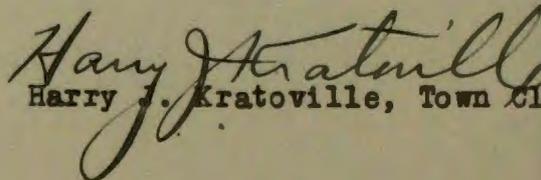
FURTHER RESOLVED, that such preliminary budget shall be filed in the Office of the Town Clerk where it shall be available for inspection by any interested person at all reasonable hours, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board shall meet at 8:00 P.M., on the 26th day of October, 1944, for the purpose of holding a public hearing upon such preliminary budget, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk give notice of such public hearing in the manner provided in Section 113 of the Town Law, and that such notice be published and posted in substantially the same form as listed in the foregoing itemized statement of estimated revenues and expenditures. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Smith Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was there-upon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, October 18, 1944 at 2:00 P.M.
