

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, October 26, 1927.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held October 6, 1927, were read and on motion, adopted .

A letter, was brought to the attention of the Board, from the Legislative Commission to Recodify the Town Law, advising of a public hearing to be held by said commission on Friday, November 11, 1927, at 10:30 A. M. in the Board of Supervisors' room in the County Court House at Mineola, New York.

On motion and vote, the Town Clerk was directed to ascertain if other towns in this section were going to send representatives to the Public Hearing of the Commission to Recodify the Town Law, and if so, Riverhead Town should be represented.

Robert P. Griffing, representing Mr. Sweezy of the Roanoke Heights Development Corporation were desirous of connecting with the Town Water System but had been advised that the water system in the town was not able to supply their needs and therefore they would wish the assurance that the Town Board would grant them a franchise to put a water system in said development.

On motion and vote it was recommended that the Supervisor appoint a committee to confer with the Water Commissioners and see what can be done to remedy this condition of a lack of water to supply Roanoke Heights Development Corporation.

Supervisor Howell appointed Justice Dwight T. Corwin and Justice Raymond H. Vail to a committee to confer with the Water Commissioners and see what can be done to supply Roanoke Heights with water.

The report of the examination of the affairs of the Town of Riverhead, made by the examiners of the Office of the Comptroller of the State of New York, was received and ordered filed and the Town Clerk was directed to acknowledge receipt of same.

The matter of appointing instructors to instruct voters as to the use of voting machines as required by law was then taken up by the Board.

On motion and vote, it was decided that the Chairman of the Board of Inspectors of each Election District should appoint instructors to instruct voters on November 3rd., 4th., and 5th., from the hours of 1 P. M. to 10 P. M., the compensation of said instructors being fixed at \$6.00 per day and the Town Clerk was directed to have notices printed in the local papers and advise the Chairman of the Board of Inspectors in each Election District of this arrangement.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow upon promissory note the sum of Eighteen Hundred Eighty One and 92/100 Dollars (\$1881.92) to pay on account of audited bills of October 25th., 1927.

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on November 10th., 1927 at 2 P. M.
