

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the
Town of Riverhead held in the Town Office on Wednesday
January 14, 1931 at 2 P. M.

Present:-

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board
held December 24, 1930 were read and on motion and vote
duly adopted.

A petition was presented signed by taxpayers within
the South Jamesport Lighting District requesting that
the resolution passed by the Town Board authorizing the
installation of a street light in front of the Post Office
at South Jamesport be rescinded. The petition was referred
to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

The lighting committee reporting on the petition call-
ing for the extension of street lights within the Wading
River Lighting District to the residence of Theodore Worona
recommended that the petition be granted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was
Resolved that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized
and directed to extend the street lights within the Wading
River Lighting District along the Parker Road to the residence
of Theodore Worona.

J. Harry Saxstien addressed the Board advising of
the changes which will take place within the Town if the
proposed town law becomes effective.

Supervisor Homan advised that he had appointed
Julian Rubenstein his clerk and requested that the Board
fix the compensation.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was
Resolved That the compensation of Julian Rubenstein as
clerk to the Supervisor be and the same hereby is fixed
at \$1800.00 per year.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That Lorimer M. Raynor be and he hereby is appointed dog enumerator of and for the Town of Riverhead for the year 1931.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor's Report for the year 1930 be published in the Riverhead News and the County Review for one week.

Whereas it has been brought to the attention of the Long Island Railroad Company that the crossings within the Town of Riverhead are in a bad condition,

Now Therefore be it Resolved that the L.I. Railroad Company be notified to give its prompt attention to the crossings throughout the Town of Riverhead.

The Town Clerk was directed to forward a copy of the foregoing resolution to the Long Island Railroad Company.

Supervisor Homan appointed the following committees:

Lighting Committee - Justice Burnside, Justice Conklin.

Highway Committee - Justice Miller, Justice Frederick.

Sanitation Committee - Justice Miller, Justice Frederick.

Audited Bills and Taxation Committee - Justice Burnside
and Justice Conklin.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, January 28, 1931.
