

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, March 25, 1931 at 2 P. M.

The Minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held, March 11, 1931 were read and on motion and vote duly adopted.

A communication received from the Riverhead Garden Club was read, extending a vote of thanks from the members of said club for the work that the Davey Tree Expert Company has done in the Town of Riverhead, in trimming the trees. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read, received from the War Department advising of the application of the Ravatone Realty Corporation to construct jetties in Great Peconic Bay at Laurel, N.Y.

A communication was read received from the Ports and Waterways Committee of the Long Island Chamber of Commerce advising of a resolution of said committee requesting the Suffolk County Regional Planning Board include in its plans for the development of Suffolk County, the dredging of channels between Howell's Point and Shinecock Canal and to include in its recommendations to the Suffolk County Board of Supervisors that these channels be improved and the cost thereof be included in the \$5,000,000 Bond issue proposed to be authorized by said Board for County-wide improvements. Said communication was ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Homan advised that the Women's Club of Riverhead had requested that the Town Board authorize the repainting of the waste cans which have been placed about the Town by the Women's club.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to have the

rubbish cans, which are in use about the Town, painted.

Mr. Littlefield of Littlefield-Alger Electric Company, advised the Board that the new controls for the traffic signals would be in operation by the end of next week.

Mr. Littlefield submitted a proposition to have a traff-o-matic signal installed at the corner of the Wading River Road 25 A and the Middle Island Road 25 at a cost of \$1775.00. Mr. Littlefield was requested to ascertain if the Lighting Company would furnish electric power for the proposed traffic light and to ascertain if the Highway Department of the State would authorize the installation of a traffic signal at this point.

It was moved, seconded and unanimously carried That a vote of thanks be extended to Deputy Sheriffs Lindsay, Miller, Barcellena and Rogers for their assistance in connection with the Dollar Day celebration in the Town of Riverhead.

On motion made by Justice Burnside, seconded by Justice Conklin, it was Resolved That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, authorize Supervisor Homan to oppose the \$5,000,000 proposed bond issue of the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County without a referendum vote.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town Clerk be and he hereby is directed to write Charles Ludlum of Oyster Bay, N.Y. and request that he take steps to have the premises on West Main Street, in the Village of Riverhead, cleaned up.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to obtain a legal opinion relative to the present and proposed future Town Law in connection with the extension of the tax roll.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on April 1, 1931 following the Public Hearing of the Town Board.
