

The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead met at the Town Clerk's Office 16 Jan. 1897 at 2'clock P.M.

All members present except Justice Ernest B. Payne.

The Town Clerk reported that he has received two bids for electric lighting. The seals were broken, and the bids were read, as follows:-

Riverhead, Jan. 18' 1897.

We will furnish the enclosed proposal at \$1324.95 per year.

We herewith submit a proposition to furnish 80 of the present lights, 27 nights per month, for \$1000 per year, to run to 1'oclock.

Hallett Bros. Milling Co.

(Printed proposal attached.)

Riverhead, Jan. 18. 1897.

We will furnish the Village of Riverhead per year 80 incandescent lamps of 32 candle power - 2580 C.P. for \$1300; or 80 incandescent lamps of 25 candle power - 2000 C.P. for \$1000. or 50 of 25 C.P. - 1250 C.P. and 10 arc of 1200 - (12000) C.P.) - 13,250 C.P. for \$1000.

Riverhead Electric Light Co.

On motion of Mr. Stackpole it was voted that the con-

tract for lighting be awarded to the Riverhead Electric Light Co., it being the lowest bidder.

On motion of Daniel Ro Young, the second proposition of the Riverhead Electric Co., was accepted, reading as follows:

"Eighty incandescent lamps of 25 candle power - 2000 C.P. for \$1000."

On motion of Town Clerk it was voted that the members of the Town Board living in the Village of Riverhead be appointed a lighting committee to generally superintend the lights under the second proposition of the Riverhead Electric Co., and that the matter of substituting arc lights for the incandescent at certain places be left to their discretion, and that the aggregate sum shall not in any case exceed \$1000 per annum.

On motion Mr. Stackpole was empowered to draw up and have executed a proper contract and a bond for the faithful performance of the same, with two sureties, in the sum of \$1000.

The meeting adjourned.
