RESOLUTIONS#499 AUTHORIZES ATTENDANCE TO AD HOC ADVISORY COMMITTEE
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Councilman Lombardi offered the following resolution, which was seconded by Councilman Prusinowski.

BE IT RESOLVED, that Richard Hanley is authorized to attend a conference of the Ad Hoc Advisory Committee on Community Development for the New York State Division of Housing and Community Renewal in Syracuse, New York on Wednesday, October 14, 1981, and that all expenses be paid out of Community Development Budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Mr. Hanley receives a \$200.00 advance, to be accounted for upon return.

RESOLUTIONS#500 AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR A FEDERAL AND
STATE GRANT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF NECESSARY SEWAGE TREATMENT
WORKS, UNDER THE APPROPRIATE LAWS OF NEW YORK STATE AND THE
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Councilman Prusinowski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Regula.

WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead herein called the "Applicant," after thorough consideration of the various aspects of the problem and study of available data, has hereby determined that the construction of certain works, required for the treatment of sewage, generally described as preparation of plans and specifications necessary to construct a 120,000 gpd scavenger waste treatment facility, and identified as Project Number C-36-0977-02-0, 02-1, herein called the "Project," is desirable and in the public interest, and to that end it is necessary that action preliminary to the construction of said Project be taken immediately; and

WHEREAS, under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as Amended, the United States of America has authorized the making of grants to aid in financing the cost of construction of necessary treatment works to prevent the discharge of untreated or inadequately treated sewage or other waste into any waters and for the purpose of reports, plans, and specifications in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 659 of the Laws of 1972 of the State of New York provide financial aid for the construction of Water Quality Improvement Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has examined and duly considered the Water Pollution Control Act, as Amended and Chapter 659 of the Laws of 1972 of the State of New York and the applicant deems it to be in the public interest and benefit to file an application under these laws and to authorize in connection therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead,

1. That the filing of application in the form required by the State of New York and the United States and in conformity with the Water Pollution Control Act, As Amended and Chapter 659 of the Laws of 1972 of the State of New York is hereby authorized including all understandings and assurances contained in said applications.

RESOLUTIONS continued

2. That Joseph F. Janoski, Supervisor is directed and authorized as the official representative of the applicant to act in connection with the applications and to provide such additional information as may be required;
 3. That, for the purposes of New York State Finance Law, Joseph F. Janoski, Supervisor be designated as Fiscal Officer of said Applicant to receive and distribute funds as the authorized Fiscal Officer of the Applicant in connection with said Project;
 4. That the Applicant agrees that it will fund its portion of the cost of said Water Quality Improvement Project;
 5. That five (5) certified copies of this Resolution be prepared and sent to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Albany, New York together with the Federal and State application.
 6. That this Resolution take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION#501 APPOINTS POLICE OFFICERS

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 314-81 which appointed four Police Officers, one of which started immediately, three of which were appointed and placed on a leave of absence until such time as their enrollment to the Suffolk County Police Academy,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Robert K. Boden, David J. Hergemiller, and John F. Danowski are reactivated with their leave of absence ending on November 15, 1981, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the effective date of employment for purposes of PBA Union Contract benefits will be November 16, 1981 at a starting salary of \$14,800.00.

RESOLUTION#503 AUTHORIZES TOWN CLERK TO PUBLISH AND POST NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Councilman Prusinowski offered the following resolution, which was seconded by Councilman Lombardi.

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and is hereby authorized to publish and post a notice of public hearing to be held on November 4, 1981, at 7:50 P.M. to amend the Riverhead Town Code Section 108-3 as follows:

RESTAURANT - A use in a building having as its sole purpose the preparation and serving of food to patrons for consumption on the premises within furnished dining areas, including as a possible accessory the serving of alcoholic beverages with meals, and which does not provide for nor permit the consumption of such food in vehicles or informally outdoors on the premises. A "restaurant" shall not be construed to include any form of live entertainment except by special permit of the Town Board or any form of drive-in, open-front or curb service eating establishments or any form of tavern, bar nightclub or similar entertainment establishment.
