

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 28, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 21, 1948 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr Fred Alexander, Mr. Louis Harding and Mr. Alexander Tuthill, representing the Roanoke Heights Association appeared before the Board in regard to the condition of Roanoke Avenue which is now under construction by the Suffolk County Highway Department. They said that there was no criticism as to what has already been done, however at present the road is in terrible condition, with deep holes and when the frost comes out of the ground, the road will become almost impassible. They asked the Board to call this matter to the attention of the County Highway Authorities in order that they may be able to make a detour for the inhabitants of Roanoke Heights. They said that it was unfortunate that there was no ingress or egress except by Roanoke Avenue.

The Board assured them that the matter would be brought to the attention of the County Highway Department with the request that they do everything possible to alleviate the situation.

An application signed by several taxpayers requesting the Board to place a street light on pole #178 on Roanoke Avenue was read and referred to the Lighting District Committee.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Long Island Lighting Company, ^{be authorized to} place one 80 C.P. street light on pole #7, Newton Avenue in the Riverhead Lighting District. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

Mr. J. Frank Bryne and Mr. Harry Ostermann representatives of the Parking Meter Co. of New Jersey explained in detail the workings of the Mark Time Parking Meter and the agreement that the Company would offer to the Town of Riverhead, should the Board except this meter.

Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways addressed the Board stating that he will need about \$20,000.00 to cover expenses for snow removal.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to borrow the sum of \$20,000.00 on Tax Anticipation Notes to pay the expenses incurred by snow removal. Justices Warner and Zaleski absent, Justices Yousik and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Leonard offered the following Resolution which was seconded by Justice Yousik,

WHEREAS, for the purpose of providing for the future growth and development of the Town of Riverhead, and affording adequate facilities for housing, transportation, comfort, convenience, safety, health and welfare of the Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has created a Planning Board for the Town of Riverhead, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Planning Board of the Town of Riverhead be and it hereby is authorized and empowered to approve subdivision plats, and plats showing new streets and highways within the boundaries of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County New York, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, may refer any matter or class of matters pertaining to planning, parking, parks, housing, transportation, safety, health and welfare, other than those referred to in Section 272 of the Town Law, to the Planning Board of the Town of Riverhead, and said Planning Board shall submit its report thereon to the Town Board of Riverhead before final action on said matters by the Town Board, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the said Planning Board shall submit its said report to the Town Board within thirty days, unless otherwise stated in a resolution referring the matter or matters to the Planning Board, and be it further


RESOLVED, that the Planning Board of the Town of Riverhead shall be permitted to make recommendations to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead on any matter or class of matters related to planning, parking, parks, housing, transportation, safety, health and welfare, and any other well being of the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The matter in regard to the/parking of trucks and cars on the streets and highways of the Town of Riverhead was dicussed and referred to the Town Attorney to report at the next meeting of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the offer of the dedication of Grangebél Park to the Town of Riverhead was referred to the Riverhead Town Planning Board. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, February 11, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.
