

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office Wednesday February 25th, 1925 at 2-00 P.M.

Minutes of meeting of February 16th, read and on motion adopted.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the following resolution was duly adopted:-

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, did heretofore and on the 27th day of June, 1923, grant to Edward J. Collins of Port Jefferson, Suffolk County, New York, a franchise and consent granting to the said Edward J. Collins the consent and permission of said Town Board to maintain and operate a motor bus line for hire over and upon certain highways in the town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, as designated in said franchise and consent and

WHEREAS, the said Edward J. Collins is the President of The Collins Bus Co., Incorporated, a transportation corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York, for carrying of passengers for hire and has petitioned this Town Board for its consent to the transfer and assignment of said franchise from the said Edward J. Collins to The Collins Bus Co., Incorporated, by his petition dated February 11th, 1925 and

WHEREAS, the franchise heretofore granted to the said Edward J. Collins does provide that an assignment thereof shall not be permitted or binding upon said Town of Riverhead, unless its approval and its consent in writing is previously given to the assignment thereof,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the consent and permission of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, be and the same hereby is given to said Edward J. Collins to transfer and assign unto The Collins Bus Co., Incorporated, a transportation corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New York for the carrying of passengers for hire, the motor bus franchise and consent heretofore granted to said Edward J. Collins by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead

bearing date the 27th day of June, 1923, granting permission to the said Edward J. Collins to operate and maintain a motor bus line for the carrying of passengers for hire upon and along the highways specified therein in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York.

This consent and permission is given subject to the same terms and upon the same conditions as expressed in said franchise and with the understanding that each and every provision contained therein shall remain in full force and effect as heretofore.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the Superintendent of Highways was authorized to purchase from the Good Roads Machinery Company an oil distributor to be attached to one of the Town trucks, upon the lease plan for a period of one year with a renewal option of an additional one year period at the rate of \$ 15.00 per day rental, which rental shall be applied upon the purchase price.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the Supervisor was authorized and directed to transfer the sum of \$ 28.26, the balance of school moneys remaining in his hands on December 31st, 1924 to the Contingent Fund.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow the sum of \$ 2500.00 to pay audited bills of February 24th, 1925.

The Town Clerk read a letter from the Long Island Railroad Company with reference to an alleged claim of \$ 2011.45, against the Town for reimbursement for a change in the construction of Sweezy Bridge.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the matter was referred to a committee consisting of Justices Dwight

T. Corwin and Robert Burnside for investigation and report.

On motion duly made seconded and carried Justices Dwight T. Corwin and Robert Burnside were appointed a committee to draft a bill to be presented to the State Legislature to permit the sum of \$ 5000.00 raised in the tax levy of 1923 for Park Purposes, with the accrued interest thereon to be transferred to such other town fund or account as may be determined by the Town Board.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the board adjourned to meet at the Town Clerk's office Monday March 9th, 1925 at 2-00 P.M.
