Resignation of De Forest Wells, Inspector of Elections,  
Dist. No. 3, was read and on motion the same was accepted.

On motion Howard V. Lane was appointed Inspector of  
Elections in and for Dist. No. 3.

Under the provisions of the compulsory education law,  
the following named persons were appointed attendance offi-  
cers in and for the Town of Riverhead, Charles R. Hallock  
for School Dist. Nos. 1, 2, 12 and 13.

Richard N. Penny for School Dist. Nos. 3, 10, 11 and 15.

Joseph H. Woodhull for School Dist. Nos. 7, 8, 9 and 14.

Egbert E. Smith for School Dist. Nos. 4 and 6.

The following Act was presented and adopted.

"An Act to license and regulate Public Hacks or Vehicles traveling circuses, shows, concerts or public amusements.

The authority to pass this resolution is found in Chapter 332, Laws of 1890.

SEC. I. On and after the 4th day of September 1896, it shall not be lawful to drive any public hack or vehicle, or for any traveling circus, show, concert or public amusement to exhibit or parade in the Town of Riverhead, until a license therefor has been obtained from said Town Board.

SEC. II. Such license for Hack or Vehicle to expire on the 1st day of Sept. 1897, will be granted on payment of a fee of Ten (10) Dollars; for circus or show, including street parade to expire at midnight on the day for which such license is issued, will be granted on payment of a fee of Twenty (20) Dollars, and for all other shows, concerts or public amusements of any kind, by payment of such license fee as the Supervisor, Town Clerk and one Justice of the Peace shall deem just and proper. Said Fees to be paid to

the Town Clerk who shall issue such licenses.

SEC. III. Any person violation the provision of Sec. I of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to a penalty of Twenty-five (25) Dollars.
