

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 3, 1948 at 9:00 A.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on February 25, 1948 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from The F.A. Bartlett Tree Expert Company, <sup>Dated March 1, 1948</sup> in regard to the care of certain trees within the limits of the Town of Riverhead inclosing a report of the work that they felt is most important in the various sections of the Town, (~~dated March 1, 1948,~~) and stating that the cost of treating the trees as outlined in the said report and painting all wounds with antiseptic wound dressing would be \$1,000.00. The communication, together with the report and offer were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the agreement of The F.A. Bartlett Tree Expert Co., dated March 1, 1948 to treat certain trees within the Town of Riverhead as outlined for the sum of \$1,000.00 be accepted. *The Resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.*

A communication was read from A. William Thegal Jr. making application for the position of Life Guard at Reeve's Park and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Theodore Gevinski tendering his resignation as Dog Warden of the Town of Riverhead, effective as of March 1, 1948. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was resolved that the resignation of Theodore Gevinski as Dog Warden of the Town of Riverhead be accepted, effective as of March 1, 1948. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Chester A. Gatz be appointed Dog Warden of the Town of Riverhead, to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board, salary fixed by Agriculture and Markets Law. The Vote, Justices Leonard and Zaleski absent, Justices Warner and Yousik Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 3, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police Report for the month of February 1948 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Rec. of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of March 1, 1948 and on motion and was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Justice Yousik offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner,

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead has studied four different makes of parking meters during the past six weeks, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board favors negotiating with the Michaels Art Bronze Company for the purchase of Mico Parking Meters for the Town of Riverhead, subject to the permission of the New York State Traffic Commission to install parking meters along the state highway. Justices Warner, Yousik and Leonard voting in favor of the Mico Parking Meter, Supervisor Kelly voting in favor of the Mico Parking Meter and Justice Zaleski not in favor of the Mico Parking Meter. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town and Highway Machinery bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 10, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.
