

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, June 4, 1957 at 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 21, 1957, were submitted to the Board and on motion made by Justice Stark and seconded by Councilman Benedict, it was Resolved that the minutes be approved as corrected. The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The May 1957 report of the Supervisor was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Police report for the month of May 1957, was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Letter dated May 20, 1957 from the Long Island Lighting Co. was read to the Board relative to eight (8) 100 c.p. aerial street lights that were placed in operation on North Side Road in the Wading River Lighting District. Communication ordered filed.

Letter dated May 28, 1957 from Suffolk Raceways, Inc., was read to the Board as follows:

"We are planning a fireworks display at the Raceway around July 4th and would appreciate your sending us the necessary application blanks for filing for fireworks permit." End.

Matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

A certified copy of a resolution adopted by the Brookhaven Town Board regarding the rescue of Benjamin Hooper, Jr., of Manorville, was submitted to the Board.

Resolution ordered filed

A letter dated June 3, 1957 from Asher Holeston, Riverhead, N.Y. was read to the Board as follows:

"I was informed that the Town Board was to act on August 7, 1956 on the curbing on Ostrander Ave. & Robinson Pkwy., and I haven't been notified that they were going to do it or not.

I have offered to stand the cost of materials and it seems to me that it is about time I should be notified by mail one way or the other, for it is a pretty messy corner." End.

Matter referred to Justice Pike.

1958

A petition dated May 23, 1957, signed by a large number of residents in the Roanoke Heights section, was submitted to the Board. These residents were in opposition to any proposed extension of Northern Parkway east to Ostrander Avenue Extension.

Engineer Alden W. Young presented a plan showing location of proposed road between Ostrander Avenue Extension and Merritts Pond Road, and called attention to the Board that if road was not established, that a drainage easement should be acquired, for the storm water from both highways, to Merritts Pond.

Justice Pike suggested that the Town Attorney negotiate for a parcel of land, (from Ostrander Avenue to the Commons), which could be used, at a later date, for drainage purposes.

Sealed proposals for 300 yards of 3/8" Dolomite for use of the Highway Department, were opened as follows:

Colonial Sand & Stone Co.-----\$6.75 per cu. yard

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict.

RESOLVED that the bid for 300 yards of 3/8" Dolomite be awarded to the Colonial Sand and Stone Company of New York, at a price of \$6.75 per cu. yard, as per bid form of the Colonial Sand and Stone Company, dated May 31, 1957. This Dolomite to be delivered at the direction of the Superintendent of Highways.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike presented to the Board, profile maps for the possible reconstruction of Sound Shore Road and Penny's Landing Road. No definite action taken in this matter.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict.

RESOLVED that the Town Board meet each and every Tuesday at 9 A.M. during the month of June 1957.

The Vote---Justices, Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED that the following be and they are hereby appointed Custodians at the Town Beaches, to serve from June 22, 1957 thru Labor Day, this year. The following was appointed: Perry Weisen, to be compensated at the rate of \$40. per week; Maitland Cooke to be compensated at the rate of \$60. per week; Frank Hughes, to be compensated at the rate of \$55. per week; and John Dolan to be compensated at the rate of \$60. per week.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the following be and they are hereby appointed lifeguards at the Town Beaches to serve from June 22, 1957 thru Labor Day, this year, to be compensated at the rate of \$45. per week. They are: William Murphy, Michael Small, Daniel Cain, George Camalich, Thomas Cornwell and William Setek.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Stark offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be authorized to borrow the sum of \$10,000 on a Bond Anticipation Note, in anticipation of the sale of serial bonds of the Town of Riverhead, N.Y., heretofore authorized to be issued for the purpose of financing the costs of the Town Highway Garage and further

RESOLVED, that the maturity date of the note be one year from date of said note and that the interest rate shall not exceed three percent.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways be authorized to attend a school for Highway Superintendents at Ithaca, New York on July 8, 9, & 10, 1957, and that all necessary expenses be paid.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town---\$13,198.21, Machinery Fund---\$809.96 and Town Highway Garage---\$38,664.00. On motion and vote, it was Resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, June 11, 1957 at 9 A.M.
