

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, June 11, 1957 at 9 A.M.

Councilman Benedict offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that the approval of the previous meeting's minutes be dispensed with until the next meeting on June 18th, 1957.

The Vote---Justices Stark and Pike, Yes; Justice Zaloga, Absent; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that the limit of bodily injury liability under insurance policy #SL 6544147, Comprehensive Liability Policy, be increased to 250,000/500,000.

The Vote---Justice Stark and Pike, Yes; Justice Zaloga, Absent; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to purchase, in each year, for the use of the Town, equipment, tools and other implements to be used for Highway maintenance in the sum not to exceed \$500.

The Vote---Justice Stark and Pike, Yes; Justice Zaloga, Absent; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A letter dated June 5, 1957, from Suffolk Raceways, Inc., was read to the Board as follows:

"In reply to your letter of May 31, 1957, we have enclosed Certificate of Insurance, map and list of fireworks as requested.

Please accept this letter, with the above mentioned, as our application for a fireworks permit. This permit will cover a fireworks display at Riverhead Raceway, Wednesday, July 3rd, 1957 at 10:30 P.M. with an alternate date of Thursday, July 4th, 1957." End

Communication ordered placed on file.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

WHEREAS, a liability insurance policy with limits of \$100,000/300,000 public liability and \$10,000/25,000 property damage having been duly posted with the Town Clerk, and all other information required by law having been furnished,

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be authorized to issue a permit to the Suffolk Raceway, Inc., Bellport, N.Y., to hold a fireworks display on July 3, 1957 at 10:30 P.M., or on the alternate date of July 4, 1957, at Riverhead Raceway, Route 58, Riverhead, N.Y.

The Vote---Justice Stark and Pike, Yes; Justice Zaloga, Absent; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. Ralph of Baiting Hollow appeared before the Board and called the Board's attention to alleged violations of Town Ordinances regarding Refuse, Camps and Trespass by the operators of Woodcliff Park and it's occupants. He was advised by Board that Ordinance Enforcement Officer was in process of inspecting this area and that Committee of Board will report on this matter at next meeting for action by the Board.

Attorney Reginald C. Smith appeared before the Board in regard to Sound Shore Road and Penny's Landing Road. He suggested that a road improvement district be created in this area in order that these roads may be reconstructed.

Matter was referred to the Highway Committee.

Justice Pike reported on the letter of Mr. Asher Holeston of Riverhead, N.Y., in regard to curbing on Ostrander Avenue and Robinson Parkway.

It was decided to authorize the Supt. of Highways to install this curbing with Mr. Holeston paying for all materials.

It was further decided that the policy of the Town Board in regard to curbs and gutters should be to encourage the construction of curbs and gutters in areas where any road damage question exists, by a procedure whereby the Town will perform the labor and the applicant will provide the materials. It was the concensus of the Board that the policy should incorporate the following requirements:

1. Each application must be acted on by the Board.
2. Applicant must agree to pay for materials.
3. Materials must conform to State specifications.
4. Materials shall be ordered by and billed to the applicant.
5. Grades shall be established by the Town. ^{form and} _{managers}
6. Materials shall be delivered at times and dates ^{specified} by the Superintendent of Highways.
7. Labor shall be provided by the Town.

The Town Clerk was instructed to answer Mr. Holeston's letter.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, June 18th, 1957 at 9 A.M.
