

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, April 21, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on April 7, 1948 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A committee from the Riverhead Polish National Alliance addressed the Board and requested the use of the property in the rear of the Highway barn on Osborn Avenue for a carnival from June 11th to 19th, 1948 inclusive.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was resolved that the Riverhead Polish National Alliance be granted permission to use the property in the rear of the highway barn for a carnival during the week of June 11th to 19th, 1948 inclusive, subject to public liability in the amount of \$300,000.00 for each accident, endorsed on the policy covering the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Proof of Publication and affidavit of posting the notice of the adoption of the Parking Meter Ordinance No. 13 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file,

Communications were read from David S. Green and Philip D. Johnson making applications for the positions of Life Guards during the summer season at the Iron Pier Beach and Reeves Beach respectively. The communications were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that David S. Green be appointed Life Guard at the Iron Pier Beach, seven days a week beginning June 26th to Sept. 6th, inclusive at a salary of \$40.00 per week. The Vote Justice Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, NO 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to place one 300 C.P. light on Pole #178 on Roanoke Avenue, place one 100 C.P. light on Pole #176 on Roanoke Avenue and remove the present 300 C.P light from Pole #177; remove the present 100 C.P. light from Pole #1 on Northern Parkway and place one 100 C.P. light on Pole #3 on Northern Parkway in the Riverhead Lighting District. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

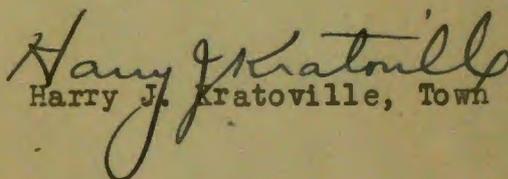
The Supervisor's report for the month of March 1948 was submitted and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the New York State Department of Public Works be requested to <sup>Make a further</sup> study of the traffic situation on Main Street, Town of Riverhead from the intersection of Osborn Avenue on the west to the intersection of Ostrander Avenue on the east, with the thought of placing traffic lights at the intersections of East Ave. and Main St., McDermott Ave. and Main St., Maple Ave. and Main St., Union Avenue and Main St. and Ostrander Ave. and Main St. to synchronize with the existing traffic lights on Main street in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was resolved that the Town Board consider the purchase of a new Walters Snow Fighter at its next regular meeting on May 5, 1948 and a notice be published to that effect pursuant to law. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town and highway machinery bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, May 5, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.
