Supervisor Zaloga asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Philip Lipetz, representing Henry A. Pollack, Corp., appeared before the Board, requesting permission to conduct a fertilizer blending operation at a location on farm on Sound Avenue.

A discussion followed, entered into by the Building Inspector, after which the matter was tabled for further study by the Board.

Mrs. Colleen Tooker, Chairman of the Town of Riverhead Narcotics Council extended an invitation to the Town Board to make inspection of the County Drug Clinic which opened last week on 312 Griffing Avenue, Riverhead, New York.

George Schmelzer, Calverton, N. Y., stated he is concerned that the Town of Riverhead is not being adequately represented by our County Legislator in connection with the comprehensive plan, zoning and assessment matters.

Supervisor Zaloga assured Mr. Schmelzer that this Town Board has held meetings with the County Legislator and the East End Townships on these matters.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways reported that trucks making disposals of debris from demolished buildings are not displaying stickers on their trucks and it is difficult to determine if they have permits to make disposals.

The Town Board directed that the drivers of these vehicles be challenged and directed the Town Clerk to provide copies of Permits issued for "Disposal of demolished buildings" to Mr. Horton and the Sanitation Department.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Police Chief Grodski informed the Board that since the Southampton Police moved their West and East Precincts to a central location in Hampton Bays and since the closing of the West Precinct on Riverside the Riverhead Police Department has had a request for assistance from the New York State Police and three Police cars and three men were assigned to quell the disturbance in the Flanders area.

Police Chief Grodski further stated that presently the Town of Riverhead has a working agreement with the Town of Southampton on mutual assistance such as the community ambulance and in the event of a disturbance we are covered for damages, however, he wonders if protection and coverage will apply when the request is made by the State Police.

Police Chief Grodski further reported that since the closing of the West Precinct the work of the Riverhead Police Finger-Printing Department has increased as people from the County Center all come to Riverhead to be processed.

After discussion, the matter was table for further review by the Board.

Supervisor Zaloga spoke on the signs recently erected at the Plaza and stated that the average person cannot see the signs.

Police Chief Grodski stated the signs were erected according to State Law regulations.

Supervisor Zaloga suggested they be faced so that people can see them and that some portable signs should be placed there also.

Building Inspector Edward R. Munson asked if the merchants of the smaller stores within the Plaza could be asked to put signs in their windows, stating, "Illegal to park in front of this store - Fire Zone".

Police Chief Grodski reported that the signs of Billy Blakes are working out satisfactorily.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Building Inspector Edward R. Munson reported as follows:

1. An application from Michael Caso for Gaoline Station Permit has been filed with his office - to be erected east of Heagys on the southside of County Road No. 58, and asked the Town Board to set a Public Hearing on the application.

2. Communication received from Suffolk County Social Services relating to proprietary family type adult homes - for anywhere in the Town of Riverhead.

Mr. Munson stated he believes this may be the sort of home as now exists in South Jamesport as it states, "its a family type home for adults - shall mean home for adults with the capacity of not less than two and not more than four guests, the admission shall be restricted to ambulance due to age and disabilities."

3. Riverhead Nursing Home will make application for doubling its quarters.

4. Mr. Munson asked if the Board had appointed some one to assist him in making inspections of the Mobile Home Parks.

Supervisor Zaloga replied, "Not as yet."

A LOCAL LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE RETENTION OF  
ELECTED ASSESSORS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of section fifteen hundred and fifty-six of the real property tax law, the three offices of assessors of the Town of Riverhead, shall continue and shall be elective as provided by the law in effect immediately prior to the effective date of said section fifteen hundred and fifty-six.

Section 2. This local law shall be submitted for the approval of the electors of the Town of Riverhead at a special election to be held in accordance with the provisions of the municipal home rule law, except that such special election shall be held not later than July first, nineteen hundred seventy-one.

Section 3. This local law shall become effective on the twentieth day after approval thereof by the electors of the Town of Riverhead at the special election specified in section two hereof and after filing and publication as required by said municipal home rule law.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

BE IT RESOLVED, That due to the long holiday period, the second Town Board Meeting for the month of February, scheduled for February 16, 1971, be cancelled and re-scheduled for Tuesday, February 23, 1971 at 10:30 A.M.


