

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the town of Riverhead held in the Town Clerk's office on Saturday, Sept. 10, 1910 at 1.30 p. m.

On motion the following were designated as polling places for the Town of Riverhead for the coming election:

District No. 1 Wading River Hall

" " 2 Odd Fellows Hall

" " 3 Lyceun (Levitt's Hall)

" " 4 Harmony Hall

On motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the Sheriff be authorized to appoint three special officers to act in the village of Riverhead during the four days of Fair from 10 O'clock p. m. until 5 O'clock a. m. at a compensation of \$3.00 per night.

On motion Lorimer M. Raynor was appointed Attendance Officer in and for the Town of Riverhead at \$2.00 per day for actual service rendered and 5 cents per mile for each and every mile traveled. This in addition to the regular allowance for horse hire.

On motion the following resolution was adopted:

An act to license and regulate circuses, shows, etc.
in the town of Riverhead.

The authority to pass this act is found in Sec. 332 of
the laws of 1890.

Sec. 1. On and after the 16th day of Sept. 1910 it shall
not be lawful for any traveling circus or show to exhibit in
the town of Riverhead until a license has been obtained from
the Town Clerk.

Sec. 2. Such license to expire at midnight on the day
for which such license is issued will be granted on
payment of such a fee as three members of the Town Board
shall deem just and proper.

Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of the act
will be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to a
penalty of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25).

On motion the Clerk was instructed to have this
ordinance published in the local papers for four weeks.

A petition was presented, signed by a number of
taxpayers requesting that a street light be placed on
Roanoke Avenue between Main Street and the next light north.

On motion the matter was left to the Supervisor to
attend to.

On motion the Town Clerk was instructed to prepare the

election notice and have same published in the local papers in the usual manner.

The following was presented from W. R. Fry, of Wading River:

Whereas, 500 Dollars was appropriated for the road at Wading River leading from Arnold's store to the Sound of which only about \$70 has been spent and Whereas, this road is but two rods in width and the County Engineer has reported that in order to make a suitable road it must be widened to three rods, It is requested that the Town Supt. of Highways be authorized to have this road surveyed as a three rod road and the surveyor's expense be paid out of the money appropriated for this improvement so that the residents of Wading River may apply to the court for the additional rod.

It is further requested that the unexpended balance of the \$500 appropriated which cannot be used this year, be used on the Middle Country Road in the work about to be commenced.

On motion the matter was laid on the table for future action.

There being a vacancy in the Election Board in District No. I as James Guy, Jr. has removed from the district, the vacancy was filled by the appointment of LeRoy Hulse as Inspector.
