

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 10, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.

Roger M. Wiley, Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 3, 1937 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

The Notice of a Public Hearing to consider the grant of franchise to Robert R. Brown of Greenport, N. Y. for the purpose of operating a bus line in the Town of Riverhead was read.

Proof of publication of the Notice of said Hearing pursuant to law was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Burns thereupon declared the hearing open and anyone who desired could be heard at this time. No one having appeared in opposition to the granting of said bus franchise the hearing was declared closed.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the Town Attorney be authorized to prepare a franchise to Robert R. Brown for the operation of a bus franchise as applied for, conditioned upon the annual payment to the Town of Riverhead of the sum of \$15.00 and further conditioned upon the applicant carrying at all times liability insurance in the amount of \$150,000.00 in a company or companies approved by the Town Board and that on failure at any time to comply with these conditions, the franchise granted shall become immediately forfeited. Said franchise further to be conditioned upon no greater rates of fare than allowed in the franchise granted by the Town of Southold and to require the same number of trips as required by said Southold Town franchise and to contain such other conditions as are set forth in said Southold franchise which the Town Attorney shall deem applicable to the Town of Riverhead. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication from H. B. Brandstein in regard to a right-of-way to his property situated north of the land of J. Howell Benjamin Estate was read and referred to the Town Attorney.

The Supervisor's report for the month of February, 1937 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

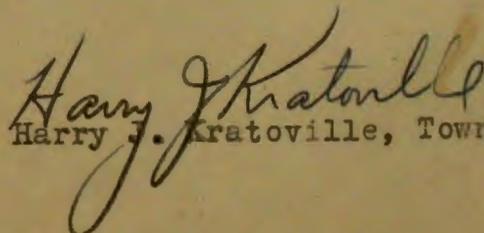
A communication was read from Mrs. Fayette Terry and Mrs. Jo. Young in regard to extending the two hour parking line below their place of business at 105 East Main Street and on motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that the two hour parking limit on East Main Street be moved to the easterly line of the Suffolk Theater property and to a corresponding point on the opposite side of the highway and that the Special Policeman in charge be instructed to place signs accordingly. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from Henry L. Delaney tendering his resignation as Special Policeman and on motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the resignation of Henry L. Delaney as Special Policeman be accepted and the communication placed on file. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Kelly it was RESOLVED that Fred. MacGlaflin be and he hereby is appointed Special Policeman for the Town of Riverhead, to serve on School Duty at the pleasure of the Board between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 9:00 A. M., 11:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M., 3:00 P. M. and 4:00 P. M. under the direction and supervision of the Special Policeman in Charge of the Police Department of the Town of Riverhead and it is further

RESOLVED that his compensation be fixed at the rate of fifty (50¢) per hour. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on March 31, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.
