

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, April 14, 1937 at 9:00 A.M.

Roger M. Wiley, Attorney and William H. Clark, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting held on March 31, 1937 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Harry Saxstien representing Mr. Louis Graff of Riverhead addressed the Board in regard to an alleged accident to Mrs. Louis Graff while riding along Roanoke Avenue in the vicinity of Middle Road, said to have been caused by the road being broken up during Sewer construction. The amount of damages being approximately \$50.00 for medical treatment.

Supervisor Burns advised that he would take the matter up with the Sewer Contractors and the Insurance Company.

A communication was read from Dr. Harold B. Smith in regard to a bill in the amount of \$243.75 for rent of a drain through the property of the Estate of Elizabeth C. Morell. It being a legal question the matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

Justice Warner offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Kelly

WHEREAS the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty (\$350.00) Dollars was inserted in the budget of the Town of Riverhead for band concerts during the summer season of 1937, to be given by the Riverhead Band.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Supervisor of the Town of Riverhead, be and he hereby is authorized and directed to pay to the Riverhead Band or Harold B. Smith, Treasurer of the Riverhead Band, the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars on the passing of this resolution; the further sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars on the 1st of July next and the further sum of One Hundred and Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars on the 1st day of August, 1937. The vote, Justices Warner, Butcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Boutcher offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Kelly

WHEREAS it is the sense of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead that a Town wide sidewalk project should be started in said Town for the protection of the children of said Town and to provide employment for workable relief cases on public improvements of a permanent character, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Superintendent of Highways be instructed to apply to the WPA for approval of a sidewalk project to apply to the Town of Riverhead and that he be instructed to take all necessary steps to secure such approval and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on the approval of such project the Town construct approximately two miles of sidewalk, on the Main Country Road, known as Route 25 one mile East and one mile West of the Aquebogue School. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Luce, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The matter of the purchase of property of Michael Marsh adjoining the Town Dump property, subject to the approval of title by the Town Attorney was discussed by the Board and was deferred until the next regular meeting.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Luce, it was RESOLVED that the Riverhead Branch of the Northfork Chapter, American Red Cross be permitted to hang their charter and honor certificate in the Justice's Court Room of the Town Hall. The resolution was carried by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Supervisor's report for the month of March was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on April 28, 1937 at 9:00 A. M.
