PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a public hearing will be held by the Riverhead Town Board at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon on the 20th day of April, 1971, in the matter of the adoption of proposed Ordinance No. 42, entitled "ALTERATIONS OR EXCAVATIONS OF PUBLIC WAYS".

ORDINANCE #42

ALTERATIONS OR EXCAVATIONS OF PUBLIC WAYS

1. WRITTEN CONSENT OF THE TOWN BOARD, TOWN SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS, SUPERINTENDENT OF SEWER DISTRICT, SUPERINTENDENT OF WATER DISTRICT.

No person, firm or corporation shall change or alter the grade of any public highway or any sidewalk or disturb, break, mar, injure, remove or deface or cause to be disturbed, broken, marred, injured, removed or defaced the surface of any part of any public highway, street, road, sidewalk, sidepath, passway or easement or any other public way of the Town of Riverhead, or maintained by it, in any manner whatsoever, without having first obtained the written consent of the Town Board. The Town Board shall refer all applications to the Superintendent of Highways, the Superintendent of the Sewer District and the Superintendent of the Water District and if the proposed alteration is in a Sewer and/or Water District, the written consent of the Superintendent of said Sewer and/or Water District shall be obtained by the Town Board before granting approval.

2. SUFFICIENT INDEMNITY REQUIRED.

The Town Board shall not give written consent that any act or acts be performed as set forth in Section 1 unless there shall have been furnished by the applicant a sufficient liability insurance policy as determined by the Town Board; and said liability insurance policy shall be for a reasonable amount and may cover one or more than one of the acts specified in Section 1 of this Article and personal injury and/or wrongful death to any person resulting directly or indirectly from the acts set forth in Section 1; and said liability insurance policy may cover any period of time necessary to include the accomplishment of one or more of the aforesaid acts, as shall be determined by the Town Board. The approval of the Town Board as to amount, form, manner of execution and sufficiency of said liability insurance policy shall be endorsed on said liability

RESOLUTION continued:

Insurance policy before it shall be filed in the Town Clerk's Office and said liability insurance policy shall be filed before said consent shall be effective.

3. EACH DAY A SEPARATE VIOLATION.

Each period of twenty-four (24) hours, that is, each calendar day during which, or any part of which, any violation of this ordinance continues, shall constitute a separate violation hereof.

4. DEFINITION.

PERSON: - the term "person" shall include any individual, firm, partnership or corporation.

5. ACTION FOR DAMAGES.

The enactment hereof or any prosecution hereunder shall not be deemed to prevent or prohibit an action for the collection of damages or penalties by or on behalf of the Town of Riverhead, or the Superintendent of Highways and/or Sewer Districts and/or Water Districts.

6. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

A violation of the foregoing shall be an offense punishable by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days, or by both.

7. SEPARABILITY.

The respective provisions hereof shall be considered separable, and if any portion hereof is declared invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect any other portion.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

WHEREAS, the Long Island Airports Limousine Service Corporation, a domestic corporation with its principal offices and place of business at 25 Willow Park Center, Farmingdale, New York, having heretofore made written application to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, pursuant to Section 66 of the Transportation Corporation Law of the State of New York, for the operation by said corporation of an omnibus within the Town, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead has adopted a resolution requiring consent of the Town Board for the operation of omnibus lines by resolution dated July 12, 1939, and

WHEREAS, Notice of Public Hearing was duly published in the News-Review calling for a public hearing on the proposed franchise to be held at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on the 6th day of April, 1971, at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon, and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held and after hearing all parties interested therein, and after due deliberation thereon, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board being of the opinion the public convenience and the best interest of the Town will be served by granting said application,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the consent of the Town of Riverhead is hereby given to said Long Island Airports Limousine Service Corporation to operate an omnibus line upon the streets of the Town of Riverhead as follows:

On the Long Island Expressway beginning at exit 68 between William Floyd Parkway and Riverhead, and further

On the Long Island Expressway between William Floyd Parkway and Edwards Road, and

On Edwards Road between the Long Island Expressway and South River Road, and

On South River Road between Edwards Road and Route 25, and

On Route 25 (West Main Street) between South River Road and Osborn Avenue.

The consent herein granted to Long Island Airports Limousine Service Corporation is however upon the following terms and conditions, to wit:

1. The consent shall be for a period of 3 years, beginning the 6th day of April, 1971, and shall terminate on the 6th day of April 1974, without any right or privilege of any kind thereafter existing in said Long Island Airport Limousine Service Corporation, its successors or assigns.

2. All omnibuses or vehicles operated on said Routes shall provide with all provisions and statutes of this State together with the rules and regulations of the Public Service Commission and/or the Department of Transportation of the State of New York.

3. Long Island Airport Limousine Service Corporation and successors or assigns shall pay to the Town of Riverhead on or before the first day of April of each year the sum of Twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars in consideration of this consent.

RESOLUTION continued:

4. The fare of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) to be charged shall comply with the schedules filed with the Public Service Commission and/or the Department of Transportation.

5. The schedules maintained shall comply with the schedules filed with the Public Service Commission and/or the Department of Transportation.

6. That there shall be full compliance with all the statutes of the State of New York and all rules and regulations of the Public Service Commission and all lawful ordinances of the Town of Riverhead applicable to the operation of said Long Island Airports Limousine Service Corporation.

7. This consent shall not be sold, assigned or transferred without the consent of the Town of Riverhead, nor shall any part of the operations on any said Routes be sublet without the consent of the Town.

8. The Town of Riverhead shall not be responsible in any way for the condition of the streets, or be required to keep them clear of ice, snow or any other obstacles, nor shall the Town of Riverhead be liable for the damage to any property of the Long Island Airports Limousine Service Corporation, its successors or assigns by reason of any snow or ice or alleged defect in its streets. Furthermore, the said Corporation, its successors or assigns, shall hold the same Town harmless and indemnifying with respect to any and all claims made by passengers upon any omnibus operator on any such routes to recover damages for personal injuries or injury to property irrespective of the cause of basis the cause of any such claim and said corporation shall defend the said Town upon any suit brought against it on any such claim.

9. Said Long Island Airports Limousine Service Corporation shall within ten (10) days after the approval of the Resolution by the Supervisor of the Town of Riverhead file with the Town Clerk a written agreement duly executed and acknowledged by him accepting the franchise and consent hereby granted to it and upon the terms and conditions herein set forth specifically coveting and degrading on its part to comply with the said terms and conditions in all respects.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all related travel and meal expenses incurred therein be paid by the Town of Riverhead and the State Police provide housing for the above mentioned officers on said dates.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

WHEREAS it is the desire of both parties to correct the error,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Article IX shall be amended to read:


"The vacation schedule shall be as follows:
