

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 20th, 1940 at 2:00 P. M.

Solomon Raffé, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 6, 1940 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Mr. Reginald C. Smith, Attorney, relative to the efforts made by the Board to solve the problem of parking and assured his full cooperation in the matter. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Mr. Burton L. Woodson, complimenting the Board for their decision to strictly enforce the 2-hour parking regulation and assured them of his whole-hearted cooperation. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Municipal Training Institute of New York State advising the Board that they are arranging for continuation of its program for the training of superintendents and operators of water and sewage treatment plants during 1940, enclosing a schedule of dates when and where these courses will be given. The matter was referred to the members of the Sewer District and Water District Committees.

A communication was read from Mrs. Marie Jeanroy of Aquebogue, requesting a permit to operate her Trailer Camp for the year 1940.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was Resolved that Mrs. Marie Jeanroy be and she hereby is granted a permit to operate a tourist camp on her property at Aquebogue, provided however, that she has complied with the rules and regulations of the Suffolk County Health Department. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Mr. William J. Lindsay, a member of the committee on the 300th Anniversary of the first settlers of the Town of Southold extended an invitation to the members of the Town Board to participate in the parade and celebration to be held in the Village of Southold on July 3rd, 1940, to commemorate that event.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was Resolved that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead accept the invitation to participate in the celebration and parade to be held in Southold on the 3rd day of July, 1940 to commemorate the 300th Anniversary of the Founding of the Town of Southold. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Supervisor Sawyer submitted his report for the month of February, 1940 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes, submitted his report of taxes collected as of March 16th, 1940 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

It was brought to the attention of the Board that Captain Engener's Circus to be held in Riverhead on May 10-11, 1940 is to be sponsored by the Riverhead Firemen's Association, therefore, on motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was Resolved that the resolution regarding a circus fee adopted on March 6th, 1940, be and the same is hereby rescinded. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.


On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski, it was Resolved that the Riverhead Firemen's Association be permitted to hold a circus in the Town of Riverhead on May 10-11, 1940. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Mr. Prime of the Travelers Insurance Company explained the survey of all insurance policies of the Town of Riverhead and made certain recommendations for the consideration of the Board. He also advised the Board that the rates for a \$5,000/\$10,000 public liability policy for the Howell M. Reeve Park would cost \$50.00 per year.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was Resolved that Clair C. Duvall be and he hereby is designated the Insurance Broker in and for the Town of Riverhead. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher and Zaleski, Yes, Justice Kelly, Not Voting, Supervisor Sawyer, Yes. Total vote Yes 4, Not Voting 1, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of February, 1940.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, April 3, 1940 at 2:00 P. M.
