Supervisor Zaloga recessed the Meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A.M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting Notice of Public Hearing on proposed Amendment to Section 4, Subdivision(a) of Ordinance No. 3- "Traffic Control and Parking"-

(a) Prohibition of Parking:

#4 - on the east and west sides of Marcy Avenue, between Main Street (Route 25) and Pulaski Street.

The affidavits were ordered filed.

Supervisor Zaloga thereupon declared the hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard on the matter.

Richard Carey spoke in favor of the proposed amendment and recommended it be adopted.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communication having been received thereto, Supervisor Zaloga declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the Meeting.

Lyndon Hallock, Sound Avenue, was unable to get into the meeting room during the Public Hearing and was permitted to speak at this time.

Mr. Hallock urged the Board to consider the amendment favorably.

Robert Roosa, Riverhead, also spoke in favor of the amendment and recommended that the Board give consideration to the installation of a traffic light at the end of Marcy Avenue to allow the traffic to get out on Route 25. He pointed out that the Post-office (annex) trucks parked on the main highway make it impossible for big trucks to get out onto Route 25.

Mr. Hallock stated that there are times when traffic is held up for 20 to 25 minutes waiting to get out onto Route 25 and asked what the procedure is to obtain a traffic light at this location.

Supervisor Zaloga advised Mr. Hallock that Route 25 is a State Highway and a request would have to be made to the State Department of Transportation for a survey for such light and the cost would be approximately \$8500 to \$10,000.

Supervisor Zaloga added that the Town Board will consider making such request.

PERSONAL APPEARANCE

Frank Remiszewski, Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, talked to the Board on the matter of his communication making complaint on the fence erected by his neighbors (Merkels), stating it was a traffic hazard and asked that something be done about the situation.

Mr. Munson explained that the fence is a permitted use as it is not over 4 ft.

Police Chief Grodski offered to take photographs because of the youth involved.

After discussion, Supervisor Zaloga advised Mr. Remiszewski that the two Town Justices are always available to help resolve matters of this nature.

DEPARTMENT HEADS

Edward R. Munson, Bldg. Inspector, reported that notices have been mailed to mobile home park owners on infractions, etc. That generally most of the parks are in satisfactory condition, exceptions being one on Harrison-Route 58, Shade Tree Lane and Glenwood Community.

After discussion the Town Board directed that summons be issued where necessary.

Mr. Munson reported that the dog incinerator matter is being handled through Mr. Roberts of the Suffolk County Environmental Agency and plans are being submitted with the request that the matter be expedited.

Supervisor Zaloga asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Jacob Harding, Esq., appeared with a large delegation of the Riverhead Merchants Committee on the matter of the Lerner Petition for change of zone (shopping center) and Permit for quad-homes.

Mr. Harding referred to a communication dated June 8, 1971, asking the Town Board for further time to consider the matter and he urged the Board to grant such request.

Mr. Harding cited Messrs. Wilson, Polacek and Tuthill as the three members of the Planning Board who voted in favor of this project and commended the two members, Messrs. Dunn and Stark for seeing fit to see the need for further time and information.

Mr. Harding said that this was not home rule but anarchy in action.

Mr. Harding outlined that Mr. Lerner and his group were permitted a hearing lasting two hours with the Planning Board and the Merchants Committee were harassed and hurried and were told they could have only 15 minutes and this did not permit a full presentation.

Mr. Harding said that the three men of the Planning Board who made this decision if not asked to resign should be reprimanded by the Town Board.

Mr. Harding said he wants to find out why the report of the Suffolk County Planning Department which is 100% negative is not quite palatable to this Board.

Mr. Harding further stated that the Committee wants to slow down this pace, that we all should examine this project together, have discussions, seek further information and suggested Seth Hubbard, Lee Koppelman and County Engineer William Matsunaye be called in for further information.

Mr. Harding stated he understood the one member of the Board who is opposed, - Councilman Young, be given the opportunity to debate this matter with the rest of the Board.

Mr. Harding called attention to the communication of ex-Supervisor Vojvoda. He pointed out that some of the members of this Board were also involved in the commitments and asked the Board to tell why they are violating the commitments.

Mr. Harding concluded by reading an article from Newsday and said that more serious consideration and more study should be given to this matter as we have never before had such an important project.

Raymond McKay, Aquebogue, congratulated the members of the Town Planning Board for their stand and spoke in favor of the project.

Fred Reeve, Sound Avenue, Riverhead, opposed the project, stating that such project would open up an influx of people, traffic, more taxes, water, sewer, fire and garbage disposal facilities and crime and asked the Board to deny the petition.

Mrs. Earl Grantham, Sound Avenue, Riverhead, representing League of Women Voters, stated opposition for the reason it would violate planning.

Mrs. Grantham raised point made by the Town Planning Board (Item 6) and displayed Chart of the Suffolk County Planning Department depicting (orange dots) shopping center - none for the Eastern end of Suffolk and (chocolate dots) multi-use centers (one for Riverhead) and read from Chart.

Mrs. Grantham spoke on the request of Northville Industries for Army Permit and read letter sent from the League of Women Voters opposing issuance of Permit and outlining reasons therefor and requesting a hearing before any action is taken.

Mrs. Grantham urged the Town Board to request a local hearing.

Mr. Harding called attention to the delegation in attendance and stated that most of the people are definitely opposed to this project.

Stanley Hagler, Riverhead, asked if the Town Board will grant additional time to further discuss the matter.

Supervisor Zaloga stated that the Board is seeking information and reports and is far from making a decision at this time and that he was not aware that one member of this Board is not in favor as the Board has not come to any decision on this matter.

Councilman Young stated that he has not looked at this proposition with too much enthusiasm - he is looking at the total value of property - the true value of the whole town and the value is controlled by supply and demand - we have stores and a certain amount of income and that income can support only a certain number of stores - the demand is controlled by population - we have 80,000 people in the Eastern part of the Island and the average income is under \$10,000 a family - any great increase in retail stores in this area can only decrease the value of what is already here - that he was elected by the people that are already here not by people that may come in 1985 and he represents these people - we have to build slowly and carefully - if we build that way we can build a firm foundation - the whole planning concept seems to be something that is built up so that you can tear it down - you have master plans and spend thousands of dollars and gradually it is whittled away.

Councilman Young concluded saying that we must go slowly and carefully and this is the way he intends to look at this proposition.

Mr. Hagler asked if they could hear anyone else on the Board.

Judge Leonard said he was waiting to study further reports.

Victoria Randolph, South Jamesport, speaking for the Environmental Council and herself, stated opposition to the shopping center and duplex, outlining reasons as water supply, waste disposal, noise and pollution factors and the Town merchants.

Supervisor Zaloga thanked the delegation for coming.

RESOLUTIONS

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

BE IT RESOLVED that this Town Board ratifies the action of the Supervisor in purchasing Time Certificate of Deposit on June 9, 1971 from Franklin National Bank in the amount of \$100,000 for 30 days from General Town Account Budgetary Funds.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and is hereby authorized to make a survey for the installation of street lights in the area of Northville Turnpike (from Middle Road to Doctors Path), Riverhead, New York.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

WHEREAS the Town of Riverhead has agreed to utilize two students from the Municipal Student Program at Stony Brook University under their Consultant Program, and

WHEREAS the students have commenced their projects as of June 1, 1971, and WHEREAS the students are to be hired for a period of three (3) months running from June 1, 1971 to September 1, 1971, and

WHEREAS the said students are Theodore H. Saks and H. Michael von Euw, G, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the above students are hired for the aforementioned program at a monthly salary of \$600.00 per month for a period of three (3) months to be paid bi-weekly commencing June 1, 1971.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Attorney John J. Munzel informed the Town Board that he has been advised by CSEA Counsel that the above appointments do not violate the CSEA Contract with the Town of Riverhead.

Messrs. Ted Saks and H. Michael von Euw, G, were introduced by Supervisor Zaloga and a brief discussion was held on the work the students are doing.

Mr. Gordon Ahlers asked if the report of all test wells in Eastern Suffolk County has been studied.

RESOLUTIONS


