

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Thursday, February 13, 1930 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board of January 29, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication was read from Walter J. Lane applying for the position of Dog Warden for the Town of Riverhead.

A communication was read from Friedman Brothers, requesting that they be allowed ^{more} time to submit an estimate on office furniture and fixtures for the new town quarters.

A communication was read from Raymond C. Brown, advising of the difficulty he experienced in keeping cars from parking in front of his driveway and requesting that the Board take action to remedy this condition.

George Benjamin of South Jamesport was present and presented a petition of property owners fronting on Green Street as laid out on Map of Village of South Jamesport as filed in the Office of the Clerk of Suffolk County, requesting that the Town Board and the Superintendent of Highways open up said street. This matter was referred to the Superintendent of Highways.

Representatives of the Littlefield - Alger Electric Company of Rockville Center were present and demonstrated traffic signals and equipment and were requested to submit specifications and prices for new equipment for the Village of Riverhead.

The Street Lighting Committee recommended that the 80 C.P. street lights on the corner of Ostrander Avenue and East Second Street and on the corner of Union Avenue and East Second Street be replaced with 250 C.P. street lights.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the 80 C.P. street lights on the corner of Ostrander Avenue and East Second Street and on the corner of Union Avenue and East Second Street be replaced with 250 C.P. street lights and that the L.I. Lighting Company be advised accordingly.

The Riverhead Civic Club submitted a suggestion that the presented signs at the approaches to the Town be repainted to read " WELCOME TO RIVERHEAD; PLEASE OBSERVE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS".

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the signs at the approaches to the Town be repainted to read " WELCOME TO RIVERHEAD, PLEASE OBSERVE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS " .

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes, requested that he be allowed a clerk to assist in closing the tax books for an additional twenty four days.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes, be and he hereby is allowed to hire a clerk to assist him with the tax rolls for an additional twenty-four days and that the compensation of said clerk be and the same is hereby fixed at \$5.00 per day.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay to Harold Robinson, the sum of \$300.00 and accumulated interest thereon for land purchased for highway leading to the Town Park property, known as Park Road.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned to meet on February 26, 1930 at 2 P. M.
