

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, February 26, 1930 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present;

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held on February 13, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication received from Roanoke Lodge # 462, I.O. O. F. advising that rent for the new quarters would start March 1, 1930 was read and referred to Supervisor Homan.

The committee having charge of receiving bids for linoleum and for furniture for the new town quarters advised that the bids were as follows:

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the bid of Jacob Meyer for linoleum, including the laying thereof, in the amount of \$1069.00 be and the same hereby is accepted.

On motion duly made and seconded it was RESOLVED That the bid of Charles McCabe for furniture, in the amount of \$3877.15 be and the same hereby is accepted

Supervisor Homan thereupon declared the resolution duly carried.

Charles O. Downs, Superintendent of Highways advised of the necessity of purchasing a carload of pipe for drainage purposes and requested that the Board authorize him to do so.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Superintendent of Highways be and he hereby is authorized to purchase the necessary pipe for use in connection with road drainage purposes.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificates of indebtedness, the sum of Four Thousand Dollars, to pay on account of audited bills of February 25, 1930.

Requests that a light be placed at the corner of Third Street and Roanoke Avenue and that the 80 C. P. street lights near the school be replaced with larger street lights were referred to the Lighting Committee for investigation.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was RESOLVED That the approaches to the railroad bridge about three miles west of the Village of Riverhead, be marked with the disk markers providing permission for same can be obtained from the State Highway Department.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 12, 1930 at 2 P.M.
