

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 17, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.

William J. Hattrick, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 3, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Proof of Publication of the notice that the Town Board will meet and consider the purchase of a Gallion Motor Grader for the Highway Department at 2:00 P.M. on this date was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Superintendent of Highways be authorized to purchase 1 - Rebuilt Gallion model 102 Motor Grader for the Highway Department for the sum not to exceed \$4500.00. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways advised the Board that he needs a new Dump Truck with low wheels for the Street Cleaning Dept. as the one now in use is pretty well worn.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the Town Board will meet at the Town Hall, Riverhead, N.Y. on the 14th day of February, 1951 at 2:00 P.M. to consider the purchase of a new Dump Truck for the Highway Department for the sum not to exceed \$3500.00 and the Town Clerk give notice thereof, pursuant to Section 142 of the Highway Law. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from the Ladies Auxiliary of the Veterans of Foreign Wars requesting permission to hold a carnival on the north end of the Fairgrounds during the first or second week in August, 1951. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Harry G. Penny, Sec.-Treas. of the Riverhead Fire Department submitted the Annual Report of the Riverhead Fire District Treasurer for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1950 and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of January 16, 1951 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly outlined in detail the Plan for Civil Defense for the


Town of Riverhead. He stated that the Plan will need at least 700 volunteers in order to be carried out effectively and hoped that it will never have to be used, however, he felt that next to a person's livelihood, this was the most important service anyone could <sup>render</sup> under present conditions and urged everyone to do his part.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Constance Swiatocha be appointed part time Stenographer to serve under the supervision of the supervisor, salary fixed at the rate of \$8.00 per day, said resolution retroactive as of January 11, 1951. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$1,000.00 from the General Town Surplus Account to the Riverhead Town Civilian Defense Account. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Account-\$2,503.60, Highway Machinery Fund-\$834.63.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, February 14, 1951 at 10:00 A.M.
