

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, March 12, 1930 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board, held February 26, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication was read from Daniel T. and Sue Fay Hinckley, of Wading River, relative to opening a new highway at Wading River. Supervisor Homan appointed Justices Fafinski and Miller, a committee to investigate this suggestion, and report their recommendations at a future meeting of the Town Board.

The Board of Assessors requested that it be furnished an additional table and this matter was referred to Justice Conklin for attention.

A request having been made that School Signs be placed near the Baiting Hollow School, Supervisor Homan was authorized to have signs provided for said School.

Supervisor Homan advised that he believed it would be necessary for him to go to Albany in connection with legislation in connection with the clam situation and requested that his expenses be paid by the Town.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That Supervisor Homan be and he hereby is authorized to go to Albany in connection with the bill affecting the clam industry and be it further resolved that the necessary expenses of Mr. Homan for this trip be paid by the Town of Riverhead.

Members of the Board advised having received numerous complaints from motorists who had passed through the Town of Smithtown, of having received summons for breaking minor traffic regulations, which did not appear to be justifiable, and they believed that if this condition continued to exist that it would prove detrimental to the interests of Suffolk County. Supervisor Homan was requested to take this matter up with the Board of Supervisors.

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on March 26, 1930 at 2 P. M.
