

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 3, 1943 at 2:00 P. M.

Seth A. Hubbard, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board held on February 15, 1943 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Supervisor Burns submitted his report for the month of February, 1943 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of taxes collected as of March 3, 1943 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Police report for the month of February, 1943 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Justice Boutcher offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission have now established the minimum age of 21 years and a maximum age of 35 years for eligibility of candidates who apply for a competitive examination for police work in the several towns of Suffolk County, and

WHEREAS, an unusual situation now exists by reason of war conditions, now therefore, the Riverhead Town Board does hereby

RESOLVE, that the Town of Riverhead does respectfully request that a minimum age of 21 years and a maximum age of 35 years be established for the first such competitive examination conducted by the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The matter of the wrecking of cars at the corner of Hamilton Avenue and Osborn Avenue was brought to the attention of the Board and on motion and vote was referred to the Police pursuant to Town Ordinance No. 8.

Two health problems, one at the corner of Hamilton Avenue and Osborn Avenue and the other on Sweezy Avenue, were brought to the attention of the Board, the complaints being, that house water was being allowed to run in the public highway. The Town Clerk was instructed to notify the Suffolk County Health Department of these matters.

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On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED, that Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways be authorized to sell the old International chain drive truck and the Fordson Tractor of the Highway Department. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Leonard and Smith, Yes, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills of February, 1943.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 17, 1943 at 2:00 P. M.
