

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 17, 1943 at 2:00 P. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 3, 1943, were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from E. E. Conroy, F.B.I. Special Agent advising that a conference of Police Executives will be held in New York City on March 23, 1943 and urged that the Police Chief of Riverhead Town attend.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that John Doscinski, Special Patrolman in Charge of the Police of the Town of Riverhead be authorized to attend the conference for Police executives at New York City on March 23, 1943 and that all necessary expenses be paid. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher and Smith, Yes, Justice Leonard absent, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 4, Absent 1, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.


Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of taxes collected as of March 16, 1943 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that Reynold Ryan and the Bankers and Shippers Insurance Co. of New York be allowed the sum of \$300.00 for damages to his truck when the top struck the Railroad Tressle over South Jamesport Avenue. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher and Smith, Yes, Justice Leonard, Absent, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 4, Absent 1, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that the sum of \$300.00 be transferred from the General Town Surplus Account to the Town Board Account. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher and Smith, Yes, Justice Leonard, Absent, Supervisor Burns, Yes. Total vote, Yes 4, Absent 1, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Town Welfare bills for the month of February, 1943.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, April 7, 1943 at 2:00 P. M.
