

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 21, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.

William J. Hattrick, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were also present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 7, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

The matter in regard to an increase of revenue for the Suffolk County Historical Society was discussed by the Board and was referred to the Town Attorney.

Mr. Selden Heatley addressed the Board in regard to the width of ^{the} highway in front of the Boening Store at Wading River, N.Y. and asked the Board to definitely establish the road boundary at that particular point. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee, Supt. of Highways and the Town Attorney.

Proof of publication of the notice that the Town Board would meet on the 21st day of March, 1951 to consider the purchase of a sand loader at a maximum estimated cost of \$2500.00 pursuant to Section 142 of the Highway Law was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Bids for the purchase of the sand loader were opened as follows:

George Haiss Mfg. Co.	\$2190.00
Municipal Machinery Co.	2113.00

The bids were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to purchase one Trowbridge single pulley trough sand loader for the Highway Department from the Municipal Machinery Company for the sum not to exceed \$2113.00. The Vote Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Bids for the construction of a wooden bulkhead approximately 130 feet in length according to specifications were opened as follows:

DeFriest's Shipyard	\$10.77 per lineal foot.
Riverhead Cement Block Co.	9.70 " " "

The bids were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that The Riverhead Cement Block Company be awarded the contract to construct approximately 130 feet of wooden bulkhead at Grangebél Park for the sum of \$9.70 per lineal foot. The vote, Justices Warner, Yousik Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Mr. Frank J. Smith stating that the insurance rates presently charged in a part of the area included in the Riverhead Fire Protection District may be reduced somewhat if certain requirements of the Suburban Division, New York Fire Insurance Rating Organization, can be met. The particular requirements are as follows: "Prior to inspection, there shall be permanently filed with the Rating Organization copies of (A) Legal papers incident to the establishment of the District, (B) Current contract for Fire Department service where required, together with the duplicate official maps of the District accurately drawn to a scale of not less than one-quarter mile per inch. These maps shall show the district boundaries, streets and roads correctly named, streams, ponds, railroads, etc., and the location of the Fire Department station." The area in which a reduction in insurance rates might be obtained would be that portion of the Fire Protection District which is outside the Riverhead Fire District but "within three miles of an approved available Fire Department Station." The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Alden W. Young, C.E. be authorized to prepare a map of the Town of Riverhead which would meet the particular requirements of the Suburban Division, New York Fire Insurance Rating Organization as stated in the above letter. The vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Firemen's Association asking permission to hold their annual bazaar and fair at the old Fair Ground during the week of August 20, 1951. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the Riverhead Firemen's Association be granted permission to hold their annual bazaar and fair on the old Fairground during the week of August 20, 1951, provided they agree to abide by the rules and regulations which ~~will~~ be adopted by the Town Board at this meeting. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved that the following rules and regulations be adopted:

TOWN OF RIVERHEAD REGULATIONS GOVERNING CARNIVALS, BAZAARS
AND CIRCUSES HELD ON PROPERTY OWNED OR LEASED BY THE
TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.

1. Since the Town does not charge any rent for the ground to carnivals and bazaars, no charge of admission to the ground shall be made by any carnival or bazaar.

2. Because of the proximity to the Central Suffolk Hospital, no public address system or any other loud sound apparatus is to be used at any carnival, bazaar or circus.

3. All carnivals, bazaars and circuses shall deposit \$100.00 in cash or certified check with the Town Clerk along with the application. This will be returned when the grounds have been cleaned up to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Highways.

4. The exact amount of ground space to be taken will be set out by the Superintendent of Highways, and under no case shall any additional ground be used without his permission.
5. The Town Board reserves the right to immediately close the entire show if it appears to the Board or to the Chief of Police that any show is lewd or indecent, or if it appears that there is any gambling in progress at any carnival, bazaar or circus.
6. No license to hold any carnival or bazaar will be given unless and until at least one week has elapsed since the holding of any prior carnival bazaar or circus.
7. No spot lights, fire works, or other similar features or displays may be used without the specific permission of the Town Board. The observation tower on the grounds is not to be used by any person taking part in any carnival, bazaar or circus.
8. Liability insurance in the sum of \$300,000.00 is to be provided by each carnival, bazaar or circus, fully indemnifying the Town of Riverhead from any and all claims that might arise because of any accident to any person at any carnival, bazaar or circus.
9. All applications are to be made to the Town Clerk of Riverhead and must be signed by both the proprietor of the amusement concern or circus owner as well as by the organization sponsoring the same.
10. All carnivals, bazaars and circuses are to close not later than midnight.
11. Any circus not sponsored by a local organization shall pay ground rent at the rate of \$25.00 per day payable to the Town in advance, and my charge admission to the ground.
12. No carnival or bazaar shall be held on Town property unless sponsored by a local organization.

The undersigned hereby accept and agree to abide by the above regulations. The foregoing rules and regulations were adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A report of the Receiver of Taxes as to the amount of taxes collected as of March 16, 1951 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were accepted and ordered placed on file.

Town Attorney Hattrick submitted a written opinion on the petition of the residents of Peconic River Park stating that in his opinion that the petition cannot be entertained by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead for the reason that it does not conform to certain requirements of Section 73 of the Town Law which governs the alteration of town boundaries. The opinion was ordered placed on file and the Town Clerk was instructed to return the petition.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town

bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund-
\$6,743.06, Highway Machinery Fund-\$1578.18.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting ad-
journed to meet on Wednesday, April 4, 1951 at 3:00 P.M.
