

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday, June 25th 1930 at 2 P. M.

The minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held June 11th 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A communication/received from the War Department advising that an application had been received from Mr. J. T. Fanning to dredge near his property at Aquebogue in the Peconic Bay.

Attorney N. O. Petty was present and presented his opinion as to the necessary steps to be taken by the town to adopt a budget system and to establish a police district therein.

It was moved seconded and carried that a special meeting of the Town Board be called for July 15th 1930 at 2 P.M. for the purpose of considering the adoption of a budget system for the Town and the establishment of a police district therein.

Lormier M. Raynor representing the Sons of Veterans addressed the Board and requested the use of the Board Meeting Room for meetings of this organization.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Sons of Veterans be and they hereby granted the use of the Town Board Meeting Room for the purpose of holding meetings of this organization.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That that Portion of Election District No. 5 bounded North by East Second Street, East by East Avenue and South by East Main Street and West by Roanoke Avenue be and the same is hereby transferred to and made a part of Election District No. 4 of the Town of Riverhead.

Mr. John Rogers of South Jamesport was present advising that the tide had cut away his property at South Jamesport and asking that the Board take steps to correct this condition stating that this was caused by the widening of the culverts under the Town Highway near his property. Mr. Rogers was requested to appear before the Board at the next meeting when

the Supervisor and the Town Superintendent of Highways would be present.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town Clerk request of the State Highway Department that signs " Through Traffic " be placed on Edwards Avenue at the intersection of Middle Country Road near Melvins' corner, Calverton, N.Y.

Opinions of J. Harry Saxstein, Attorney, regarding constables fees and Justices of the Peace fees and traveling expenses, were presented and ordered placed on file.

Mr. John H. Skinkaytis of South Jamesport, and J. Harry Saxstein, his attorney, were present and protested against the Town opening a highway known as Green Street through the property which Mr. Skinkaytis purchased, without paying Mr. Skinkaytis for same.

This matter was held over until the next meeting of the Board.

Attorney J. Harry Saxstien, presented a petition and acceptance for the transfer of the motor bus franchise from Ernest Naber to Edwin A. Remlein.

WHEREAS the Town Board of Riverhead Town did on or about the 9th day of January, 1929 grant a franchise to Ernest Naber to operate a public motor bus line from the Village of Riverhead to the Village of Port Jefferson in Suffolk County, New York, ~~and~~ *in so far as said route is in Riverhead Town, and*

WHEREAS the said Ernest Naber has petitioned the Town Board for permission to transfer all his right, title and interest in said franchise to Edwin A. Remlein of Flanders, L.I. who has agreed to continue the operation of said motor bus line in accordance with all the terms and conditions contained in said franchise, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that permission is hereby granted to the said Ernest Naber to assign and transfer all his right, title and interest in said franchise to Edwin A. Remlein, with the same force and effect as if said franchise had been granted by the Town of Riverhead to Edwin A. Remlein in the first instance.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet on July 9th 1930 at 2 P. M.
