The following notice relative to establishing a
lighting district was published in the Riverhead News and
County Review for one week.

A Petition has been filed in the Town Clerk's Office of
the Town of Riverhead requesting the extension of the present
lighting district in the Village of Riverhead, Suffolk County,
N. Y. as follows:

Commencing on Main Street at the termination of the
present lighting district near the corner of property owned
by Frank G. Yetter, extending thence westerly along said Main
Street to the southwest corner of property owned by George
Pugsley. The above petition has been signed by the majority
of the taxpayers within the above mentioned district to be
extended and notice is hereby given that the Town Board
of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk and State of

New York will act upon said petition at a meeting to be held in the Town Clerk's Office on Monday, October 14th 1912, at 4:30 O'clock P.M.

On motion it was ordered that a new lighting District be established within the Town of Riverhead and within the following bounds: Bounded North by the Long Island Railroad, East by the Westerly line of the Present lighting district, South by Peconic River and West by the West line of the property now owned by Dan. F. Reeve, said west line extending from the Long Island Railroad to the Peconic River.

On motion the Supervisor was appointed Committee of one to confer with the property owners in above district as to the Number of lights needed in said district.


A Petition was presented requesting that a light be placed on the West side of the Fair Grounds on Osborn Avenue.
