

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 16, 1951 at 3:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 2, 1951 were read and on motion and and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the New York State Public Service Commission giving notice that a public hearing will be held in their office 233 Broadway, New York, N.Y. on May 24, 1951 at 10:00 A.M. on the matter of the rules and regulations relating to the installation of gas service connections filed by the Long Island Lighting Co. The notice was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Sigal Realty Company suggesting that the drive-way between the Firestone Building and his building on the south-side of East Main Street be turned into a walk-way instead of a drive-way to eliminate a hazardous condition. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from James J. Jones of Wading River, N.Y. making application for the position of life-guard at the Wading River Beach this summer. The application was ordered placed on file.

on motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that James J. Jones of Wading River, N.Y. be appointed Life-guard at the Wading River Beach from June 29, 1951 to Labor Day, inclusive, subject to the approval of the Civil Service Commission, to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board, salary fixed at the rate of \$40. 00 per week. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard, yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of May 16th, 1951 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Mr. Louis Dormand addressed the Board explaining all the facts and figures in regard to the spile and cat-walks to be placed in Peconic River for the purpose of receiving the Freeport Yacht Club Flotilla this summer. He commended the Board for their quick action in the matter and further recommended that the Dock Ordinance be amended so that boats could be moored for a longer period of time, with possibly a fee charged. He said that he would be very glad to co-operate with the Town Attorney when and if the amendment is made.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the sum not to exceed \$600.00 be authorized for the purpose of constructing two cat-walks on Peconic River along the Parking Field and further Resolved that Alden W. Young, C.E. be authorized to prepare the proper maps for the application for a U.S. Army, Corps of Engineers permit. The vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was there-upon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was RESOLVED, that the plan prepared at the request of this Board for the improvement of town highways and covering all projects contemplated by it, pursuant to Chapter 824 of the Laws of 1950, as filed in the Office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk on the 16th day of May, 1951, be and the same is hereby adopted, and be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of such plan be filed in the appropriate State and County offices in accordance with the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 824 of the Laws of 1950. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was there-upon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved, that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to place one 600 C.P. street light on Pole 237 on Main Road; one 100 C.P. street light on Pole 4J across from Jamesport School; one 100 C.P. street light on Pole 10 on Manor Lane, all in the Jamesport #2 Lighting District, and further

RESOLVED, that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to remove the 100 C.P. street light from Pole 127 and place same on Pole 128 on Peconic Bay Blvd in South Jamesport #2 Lighting District, Town of Riverhead, New York. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Gatz it was RESOLVED, that the Suffolk County Supt. of Highways be requested to eliminate parking of cars on both sides of Roanoke Avenue from Northville Turnpike to the Long Island Railroad tracks and also establish a No Parking area for a minimum of 25 feet from the intersection of Roanoke Avenue on both sides of Northville Turnpike, Town of Riverhead, New York. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead request permission from The Corps of Engineers, Dept. of the Army, 80 Lafayette St., New York, N.Y. to construct two mooring docks in Peconic River approximately one-quarter of a mile east of the highway bridge on Peconic Avenue. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows; General Town

Fund-\$1479.73, Highway Machinery Fund-\$1342.00.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 6, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.
