

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 2, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on Wednesday, May 19, 1948 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to pay the Mico Art Bronze Company the sum of \$733.08, said sum being one half of the gross collection from the parking meters during the month of May 1948 as per the agreement between the Town of Riverhead and the said Mico Art Bronze Company. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Solomon Raffe, Attorney, representing the Mid-Island Lumber Company addressed the Board in regard to the restriction of parking on the west side of Roanoke Avenue stating that due to the type of business of the Company they would like to have a twenty or twenty-five minute parking zone in front of their place of business. The matter was referred to Justice Warner of the Police Committee to investigate and report at the next meeting.

Justice Warner offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Leonard,

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting held on May 19, 1948, a resolution was adopted subject to permissive referendum accepting the offer of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Suffolk to construct and dredge a navigable channel in Meeting House Creek from the seven foot channel in Peconic Bay to the head of Meeting House Creek provided the Town of Riverhead pay one half the cost of the work, and

WHEREAS, the construction of a bulkhead at the head of said Meeting House Creek in front of Town Property adjacent to Peconic Bay Boulevard would provide that area of the land fronting on the bulkhead to be filled in with the dredged out material and thereby making said channel more accessible to the public and for their convenience, advantage and enjoyment, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that a bulkhead about 200 feet long be constructed at the head of Meeting House Creek in front of Town Property adjacent to Peconic Bay Boulevard at a cost not to exceed thirty-five hundred dollars, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a capital note of the Town of Riverhead in an amount not exceeding \$3500.00 and to be redeemed from the levy of taxes for the year 1948-49 be issued for the purpose of providing funds to pay the cost of such work and be it further

RESOLVED, that the adoption of this resolution be made subject to a permissive referendum and subject further that the resolution heretofore adopted by this Board on May 19, 1948 accepting the aforesaid offer of the Board of Supervisors for the construction of the navigable channel in Meeting House Creek becoming effective. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Proof of publication and affidavit of posting the notice of adoption of resolutions subject to permissive referendum dated May 19, 1948 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Warner it was resolved that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to construct a concrete wall at the top of the ramp on Park Road in Reeves Park, Town of Riverhead. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to attend the school for Superintendents of Highways to be held at Ithaca, New York during the week of June 20, 1948. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 16, 1948 at 2:00 P.M.
