The Meeting was called to order at 10:30 A.M. by Supervisor Zaloga.

Communication from Dept. of Public Works dated 1/7/70 attached to above letter from Mrs. Adamson states that a portion of this road is being widened in connection with the construction of the Long Island Expressway and that the officials of the Town of Riverhead being familiar with the work can be of assistance. Filed.

Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton informed the Town Board that he has made reply to Mrs. Adamson and has filed a copy of the letter with the Town Clerk.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Franklin Gold, 25 Richmond Street, Brooklyn, N. Y. 11208, (seasonal resident of Wildwood Acres, Wading River, N. Y.) congratulated the newly elected members of the Town Board and wished them success.

Mr. Gold read a statement relating to the condition of the roads in the Hulse Landing and Wildwood Acres area and asked that the Board consider new legislation under health and welfare reasons for authority to accept these roads.

Mr. Gold stated that the majority of the residents in the area are retired people with limited incomes and are unable to assume additional tax burdens.

Town Justice Costello informed Mr. Gold that this matter has been discussed with the residents of the Wildwood area and it was hoped that some legislature could be enacted to enable the Town to accept these private roads even though they are only 12 feet wide, and it was his understanding that the people were going to petition the Town to ask Albany for special legislation to do this.

Judge Costello further advised Mr. Gold that there is no authority in the Town Law to permit the Town to accept the roads or to correct the water and drainage problems within the area.

Supervisor Zaloga suggested that a meeting be scheduled with the residents of the area to meet with the Town Board to further discuss this matter.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Mr. John P. Riesdorff informed the Board that the former Salvation Army property is up "for sale".

Mr. Riesdorff spoke on chlorination and asked that the Town Board not take any hasty action on the matter of chlorinating the water supply of the Riverhead Water District.

ROLLING WOODS AT ROANOKE SECTION II SUBDIVISION:

Robert L. Tooker, Esq., submitted the following documents for filing in the Office of the Town Clerk.

1. Agreement between Emjay Properties and Town of Riverhead for Construction of Highways.
2. Performance Bond-Emjay Properties, Inc. Principal, to the Town of Riverhead, in the amount of \$45,000.

REPORTS

Town Justice Costello submitted a copy of the survey on the seven acres of property located at Wading River which is to be donated to the Town by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn for recreational purposes and suggested the Board meet at an early date to look into various legal aspects of deed, etc.

Town Justice Costello reported on the matter of an autoclave at the Town Dump disposal area and stated that the Long Island Lighting Company has estimated that an autoclave of the size we specified would cost \$7500, in addition thereto, they would have to extend their service for wiring - 6700 ft. which would cost \$90.71 monthly.

Judge Costello stated he would look into the matter of price for gas service and decide which service would be more advantageous for the autoclave.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways submitted a proposal for new Rules and Regulations for Acceptance of Highways. Filed.

The matter was tabled for further study by the Board.

Mr. Horton submitted specifications and estimate form of McRae Bros., Riverhead, N. Y., for repairing roof on Town Highway Garage building in the amount of \$2,250. Filed.

The matter was discussed by the Board and it was agreed that the repairs be made.

Mr. Horton informed the Board that the delivery of two 1970 Dump Trucks (without bodies) bid for which was awarded to Tryac Truck & Equipment Co., on October 7, 1969, for delivery in 6 to 10 weeks has not been made and asked the Board if he should re-advertise for bids, inasmuch as Tryac cannot ascertain when they will be able to make the delivery.

The matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

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POLICE DEPARTMENT

Police Chief Grodski talked to the Board about the matter of entering into a contract with East End Typewriter for maintenance of typewriters at a sum of \$150 per annum, payable semi-annually.

After discussion, the Board decided that the matter of a maintenance contract be abandoned and that calls for repairs be made as needed.

Supervisor Zaloga recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting Notice of Public Hearing in the matter of proposed amendments to Town Ordinance No. 3 "Traffic Control and Parking".

Affidavits ordered filed.

Thereupon Supervisor Zaloga declared the Hearing open to anyone who wished to be heard in favor of or against the aforesaid amendments.

J. Wilson Stout, East Main Street, Riverhead, addressed the Town Board and commended the members for the action they have taken in proposing this change to this ordinance which is designed to remedy one of the worst traffic hazards that the people ever had in this area.

Mr. Stout further stated that he is sure that when these amendments are adopted and properly enforced that the purpose will be served.

Mr. Stout informed the Board that the people in the area had told him that they have made complaints to local and state police and were advised that if the cars were parked inside of the telephone pole lines that nothing could be done about it.

Supervisor Zaloga informed Mr. Stout that if these amendments are acted upon favorably that a survey of the area involved will be made immediately.

Mr. Stout further stated that sometime ago when Mr. Spahner had an auto repair shop in the area it was a model for neatness and cleanliness and now under the present ownership it has deteriorated into one of the worst possible junk yards.

Mr. Stout suggested that the Junk Yard Ordinance be revised to correct the present situation which is a disgrace to the entire township.

Harold Foster, 91 Fairway Ave., stated he ~~was~~ almost hit twice and suggested a traffic light be installed as it is impossible to see what is coming from the west.

Bill Hubbard, Jr., P. O. Box 603, Riverhead, stated he agrees with Messrs. Stout and Foster.

Raymond Wazlo, 24 Fairway Ave., stated he ~~uses~~ the affected highway every-day and finds it very dangerous and favors the proposed amendments.

DeWitt Benjamin, Fairway Ave., stated he favors the proposed amendments.

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PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A.M. continued:

William Medsger, 1110 East Main Street, spoke in favor of the proposed amendment for presently cars and trucks make "U" turns right into his lawn.

John J. Spalner, Fairway Avenue, spoke in favor of the proposed amendments.

William G. Hubbard, Hubbard Avenue, spoke in favor of the proposed amendments.

Unidentified gentleman stated he favored the proposed amendments.

Police Chief Grodski stated that the Police Department has issued summonses for vehicles parked within the boundaries of the road and also for violation of the Junk Ordinance and the disposition is up to the Courts.

Chief Grodski further stated that a new law effective January 1st permits the Police Department to remove abandoned cars at the expense of the owners.

John P. Riedsorph suggested that Alden W. Young be requested to survey the property line in connection with the fire hydrants in the area.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Zaloga declared the Hearing closed.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:15 A.M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting Notice of Public Hearing in the matter of Proposed Ordinance No. 40, entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Outdoor Circuses, Shows and Exhibitions".

Affidavits ordered filed.

Supervisor Zaloga thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to speak in favor of or against the aforesaid proposed Ordinance No. 40.

John J. Munzel, Town Attorney, advised the Board that one provision of the ordinance as proposed under Subdivision 3, Item 7 - "written consent of every adult person actually residing, etc." - the Courts have held that you cannot prevent someone from doing what may be beneficial by mere inaction or perversity or any such reason.

Mr. Munzel stated that it can be omitted or a provision inserted whereby the applicant file written proof of requesting consent so that everybody within 1000 ft. has knowledge of what is being proposed and can come in and object at the appropriate time.

Mr. Munzel further stated that the provision as written is not beneficial and will be struck down if tested.

Mr. Munzel also pointed out that there is a very substantial time gap and it could use considerable tightening.

After further discussion, it was decided that the ordinance as proposed be given further study and consideration by the Town Board and the Town Attorney and be re-submitted with any deletions or additions thereto at the next meeting of the Town Board.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:15 A.M. continued:

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Zaloga declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLUTION REGARDING CIVIL DEFENSE RADIO
COMMUNICATION UNIT.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York is desirous of maintaining for the public health and well-being of the Civil Defense Communication Unit in the state of readiness,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby ordains, pursuant to Section 9134 subdivision 1 of the Unconsolidated Law of the State of New York that John J. Munzel, Esq., Town Attorney for the Town of Riverhead, is hereby ordered to execute an agreement for use of the Armory of the State of New York Division of Military and Naval Affairs. Said agreement provides that the Town of Riverhead shall be obligated to pay \$52.00 for public liability insurance per year and such is the full compensation to be paid by the Town of Riverhead for the Civil Defense Communications Unit for the period beginning on the 19th day of January, 1970 at 7:00 P.M. and ending on the 16th day of January, 1971 at 11:00 P.M.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

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RESOLUTION

Councilman Young offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:-

WHEREAS, The Town Planning Board of Riverhead by a Resolution dated April 30, 1969, set forth the prerequisites to the approval of the proposed subdivision known as "ROLLING WOODS AT ROANOKE, SECTION I I", and

WHEREAS, One of the prerequisites to the approval of the proposed subdivision is the filing of a Performance Bond in the amount of \$45,000.00 with the Riverhead Town Board guaranteeing the faithful completion of the construction of highways within the proposed subdivision in accordance with the construction specifications in the "Rules and Regulations for the Dedication of a Public Highway in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York," and in accordance with the conditions set forth in the aforementioned resolution of the Town Planning Board dated April 30, 1969, and

WHEREAS, EMJAY PROPERTIES, INC. as Principal, JACOB STEIN, MAX STALLER and BENJAMIN KASPER as Co-Principals, and REPUBLIC INSURANCE COMPANY as Surety, have filed a Performance Bond in the amount of \$45,000.00 guaranteeing to the Riverhead Town Board faithful performance in the completion of the roads to be constructed in the proposed subdivision known as "ROLLING WOODS AT ROANOKE, SECTION II", which Bond sets forth completion of the roads in a period not exceeding two (2) years, all being pursuant to Section 277 of the Town Law, Section III, Paragraph F of the Rules and Regulations of the Planning Board for the Subdivision and Platting of Land,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Surety Bond in the amount of \$45,000.00, naming EMJAY PROPERTIES, INC. as Principal, JACOB STEIN, MAX STALLER and BENJAMIN KASPER as Co-Principals, REPUBLIC INSURANCE COMPANY as Surety, and the RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD as Obligee, for the faithful performance of all conditions set forth in the Resolution of the Town of Riverhead Planning Board, dated the 30th day of April, 1969, with reference to the proposed subdivision to be known as "ROLLING WOODS AT ROANOKE, SECTION II", in Riverhead, New York, is satisfactory to the Town Board as to form, sufficiency, manner of execution and surety, for the completion of such improvements as are not constructed.

The adoption of the foregoing resolution was seconded by Councilman Grodski, and duly put to a vote on roll call which resulted as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby ordains and enacts the following amendments to Ordinance No. 3, "Traffic Control and Parking", as amended; by adding the following new subsections to Section 4 (a):

SECTION 4. PARKING, STANDING AND STOPPING.

(a) Prohibition of parking: The parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited in locations as follows:

25. On the north and south sides of Elton Street from Main Street (Route 25) to a point 150 feet west of Main Street.
26. On the west side of Main Street (Route 25) from a point 150 feet south of Elton Street to a point 150 feet north of Elton Street.
27. On the east side of Main Street (Route 25) from a point 150 feet south of Fairway Avenue to a point 150 feet north of Fairway Avenue.
28. On the north and south sides of Fairway Avenue from Main Street (Route 25) to a point 150 feet east of Main Street.

AND the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to enter the said amendments to Ordinance No. 3 "Traffic Control and Parking", as amended; in the minutes of the Town Board and to publish a copy once in the News-Review, the official newspaper published in the Town, and to post a copy of the same, on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk, pursuant to Subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, and file in her office affidavits of said publication and posting.

The amendments to aforesaid Ordinance No. 3 "Traffic Control and Parking", as amended, shall take effect ten (10) days after such publication and posting.

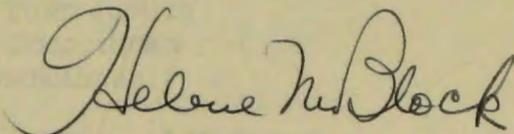
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RESOLUTION continued:
