

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 20, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 6, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A delegation from the Jamesport-South Jamesport Fire Department, Inc. composed of Frank Case, Frank Holt and Joseph Wowak, and presented a letter requesting the Town Board to award a contract for fire protection for the year 1952 to the Jamesport-South Jamesport Fire Department, Inc. for the area that is now embraced in its charter as granted by the State of New York. It gave a report as to the amount of equipment it now has which will be added to, and it stated that as a result of the training the Dept. has had and with the interest the members have in fighting fires, they feel they are suited to combat any fire that may occur in that area. The communication was ordered placed on file.

An order was read from the New York State Public Service Commission granting to Louis A. Fuoco its permission and approval to operate an omnibus line over the following streets, avenues and highways in the Town of Riverhead: State Route 25 between the Brookhaven-Riverhead town line and Court Street, Court Street between Main Street and Griffing Avenue, Griffing Avenue between Court Street and Main Street. The Order was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Long Island Lighting Company calling attention to our order of May 1, 1951 requesting 2 100 C.P. street lights one each on poles #19 and 23 on Marcy Avenue, however according to their spacing clause in the contract, there should be 3 lights installed in this area or relocate all lights to the poles that the Board feels would be satisfactory. The communication was ordered placed on file.


Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes filed his final report <sup>of</sup> to the amount of taxes collected as of June 15, 1951 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Benjamin Karlin be authorized to exercise usual powers of a Police Officer for private persons on private property. He may wear a police uniform and badge, but is not a town employee. The Town shall not be responsible for his actions nor for injury to him while so acting. This authorization shall be at the pleasure of the Board, but not beyond December 31, 1951. Acceptance of this authorization shall be on the above conditions. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hold a public hearing in the Town Hall at Riverhead, New York, on Wednesday, July 18, 1951 at 2:00 P.M. in regard to the contracts for fire protection for the Riverhead Fire Protection District for the year 1952 and that the Town Clerk be authorized to such notice pursuant to law. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund-\$1737.23, Highway Machinery Fund-\$1,019.56

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, July 3, 1951 at 1:30 P.M.
