

Minutse of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 1, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on April 17, 1946 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

County Treasurer, Milton L. Burns representing the Riverhead Republican Club addressed the Board stating that the Club wished to go on record as favoring the purchase of land for permanent parking fields in the Town of Riverhead.

A communication was read from Fireman George A. Jackson, Jr., Advertising Solicitor for the 74th Annual Convention and Tournament of the New York State Volunteer Firemen's Association to be held in Riverhead on August 20-23 1946, asking the Board to advertise the Town of Riverhead in their official program which will be sent throughout the State. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead expend the sum of \$100.00 for Advertising in conjunction with the 74th Annual Convention and Tournament of the New York State Volunteer Firemen's Association to be held in Riverhead on August 20-23, 1946. The Vote Justice Zaleski absent, Justices Warner, Yousik and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 4, Absent 1, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Warner offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Yousik

WHEREAS, Thomas J. Quinn, residing at Patchogue, Suffolk County, New York, the previous holder of a franchise granted by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead on the 19th day of December 1940 for the operation by him of motor vehicle buses for the transportation of passengers for hire over certain designated routes within the Town of Riverhead and which franchise expired on the 18th day of December, 1945 has made written application to the Town Board of this Town by petition dated and verified the 13th day of April 1946 pursuant to Section 66 of the Transportation Law of the State of New York, as amended, for a renewal of said previous franchise for a five year period commencing as of the 19th day of December 1945 and ending on the 18th day of December 1950, it is

RESOLVED AND ORDERED, that a public hearing be had by this Town Board upon said application at the Town Board Room, Odd Fellows Building, corner of Roanoke Avenue and Second Street, Riverhead, New York on the 15th day of

May 1946 at two o'clock in the afternoon, at which time all persons attending will be heard for or against the granting of a consent, franchise and right to said Thomas J. Quinn to operate omnibus lines or routes for the purpose of carrying passengers for hire, upon and along the roads, streets and highways within the Town of Riverhead as more particularly described in said application; and that on or before May 3rd, notice of this application and hearing be published once in the Riverhead News and County Review and be posted on the bulletin board in the Office of the Town Clerk, Riverhead, N.Y. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from Harry G. Penny, Secretary of the Riverhead Fire Department reporting the injuries of Roger Wells and Fred Lutters, Firemen, received on April 20, 1946. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from George Moore making application for the position of Life Guard at the Town Beach for the summer months. The communication was ordered placed on file.


A communication was read from Wallace Seaman Jr. tendering his resignation as Police Patrolman of the Town of Riverhead, effective as of May 1, 1946. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the resignation of Police Patrolman Wallace Seaman Jr. be accepted and further Resolved that this Board commend Patrolman Seaman for his excellent service and wish him much success in the future. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Police and the Welfare reports for the month of April 1946 were submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, May 15, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.
