

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 15, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 1, 1946 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Asher Holstein requesting that a street light be placed on the second pole on Ostrander Avenue, north of Elton Street.

A communication was read from Alice M. Hart tendering her resignation as Acting Town Welfare Officer of the Town of Riverhead to become effective June 1, 1946 or as soon thereafter as replacement can be made. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the resignation of Alice M. Hart as Acting Town Welfare Officer be accepted with regret, said resignation to become effective as of June 1, 1946 or as soon thereafter as replacement can be made. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Notice of Public Hearing upon application of Thomas J. Quinn for consent to operate a Motor Bus Line in the Town of Riverhead was read.

Proof of publication of the above notice was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file,

Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

Mr. Isidore Scheinberg, Attorney addressed the Board stating that there is a great need for a waiting room and comfort station for the convenience of the people who come to Riverhead on the buses and urged the Board to take this into consideration before the franchise is granted for the reason that the franchise should not eliminate any obligation on the part of Bus Companies in regard to this matter.

No one else wishing to be heard, Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the hearing closed.

On motion and vote, the matter of the application of Thomas J. Quinn for consent to operate a motor bus line in the Town of Riverhead was deferred until the next regular meeting of the Board.

Rev. Clarence Wells and Mr. J. Wesly Warner of Aquebogue, N.Y. appear-

ed before the Board in regard to the acceptance of the roads in Hoccabauk Park as Town Highways. The matter of certain easements given by deed to each property owner ~~and~~ the beaches at Hoccabauk Park was discussed at length and in the opinion of the Town Attorney, all property owners who have such easements must dedicate their rights in that strip of beach, the width of the road extending to the bay, to the Town before the road known as Pine Street on the map of Hoccabauk Park can be accepted as a town highway.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that J. Fred Dugan and Frank J. Smith be authorized to appraise the parcels of land between Griffing Avenue and Roanoke Avenue which are now used as a town parking field and also the parcel of land on the corner of Benjamin Place and Second Street owned by Dr. Harold B. Smith and Dr. Walter Smith and that the necessary expense be paid. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Town Offices be closed at 4:00 P.M. beginning on June 1, 1946 to Labor Day. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.


The Supervisor's report for the month of April 1946 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Town Clerk be authorized to publish notice that the Town Board will consider the purchase of a new power sweeper for the Highway Department at a meeting to be held on Wednesday, June 5, 1946 at 2:00 P.M. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Justice Zaleski brought to the attention of the Board the necessity of changing the boundary line of the Riverhead Fire Protection District in order that Roanoke Heights could be included into the Riverhead Fire District. This he said was for the reason that the new Riverhead Hospital should have full fire protection. The matter was referred to Justice Zaleski and Town Attorney Lundberg.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 5, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.
